





We would like to introduce our judges, one per month, as a special insight into the show. As you know, we will have 4 judges for this show, working in a team of 2. So, here goes... introducing our FOURTH judge:

Cindy started her career as an interior designer in Arizona and Utah and then specialized in creating applique wall hangings and clothing for boutiques. Since being introduced to the rotary cutter and half-square triangle she's been unstoppable.

Cindy makes commission quilts and samples for various international companies and individuals (including RJR and P&B). She is an NQA certified Quilt Judge and teaches quilting and clothing specialty classes at Bernina Sewing Center in Omaha as well as lecturing and teaching classes around the country.

She is qualified to judge Master Quilts, Modern and art quilts of all techniques. She specializes in teaching rotary and sewing machine skills in all aspects of quilt making to all skill levels. "Professional Quilter Magazine" nominated her for National Teacher of the Year in 2009.

January Block of the Month

Hello everyone! My name is Catherine Holliday and I am the new Block of the Month Chair for 2020. My New Year's resolution, among others, was to contribute more to the Guild by taking that first step of volunteering for a position. Please be patient with me as I get my head wrapped around what I am supposed to be doing. December was a whirlwind month which left me with little time to come up with a quilt block for January and prepare this article for the newsletter.

As we begin this new decade...wait, is that right? It sounds right, but I had to look it up because there is some controversy over this. According to The Farmer's Almanac, decades begin with the numeral I and finish with a 0. So, in short, about 2020 years ago the year I AD was immediately preceded not by a 0, but by I BC, so we are in the end of this decade.

At the January 2020 meeting you will be turning in the blue, silver and white blocks you picked up at the December Christmas Party along with any extra blocks you may have prepared.

JANUARY BLOCK OF THE MONTH - Block in a Block in a Block - Finishes at 12.5".




COLORS - Red, Navy, Print and White

Each kit will come with enough fabric to make 2 blocks. Please make the two blocks in the kit and two additional blocks from your stash at home. Remember these go to Charity Bee to be finished into quilts and given to one of our many charities that we support. There is no limit to how many you can make for Charity Bee.

LET'S GO PIECE THIS BLOCK!

FIRST: We are starting with the 5" red square for the center.

SECOND: Take the two 6.5" navy squares and cut each square diagonally.



Next, sew right sides together a triangle unit on opposite sides of the block, centering the triangle with the square. (To center I fold the triangle in half and crease it and fold the center square in half and crease it, then match the two creases.) Use a scant 1/4" seam allowance. The excess will hang off the edges of the block. Press seams toward the navy. Trim the overhanging edges even with the center block

January Block of the Month

Sew the two remaining navy triangle units to the top and bottom of the square, centering the units with the square, and press seams toward the navy. Square the block up to a 7" square. You have your first block in a block.



THIRD: Take the two 7.5" print squares and cut each square diagonally, exactly as you previously did on the navy squares.



Center and sew 2 triangles to opposite sides, then center and sew the remaining 2 triangles to the remaining sides. Press seams toward the print fabric. Square the block up to 10.5" square. You now have a block in a block in a block.





```
FOURTH:
```

Take the 2- 10.5" white strips and sew to each side of the block.



Then take the remaining 12.5" white strips and sew to the top and the bottom of the block. Trim the block equally all the way around so you end up with

a 12.5" square. I pressed the white trim towards the block.


