Topic—Paper piecing made simpler

WHO THE HECK IS QUILT MAVEN DAVE?



There was one technique that I was immediately drawn to, and that was paper piecing. I thought it was so cool because of the intricate and accurate results you get. The only drawback was that it was really difficult to wrap my brain around, kinda like upside down and backwards. If you've ever tried it, you know what I mean. But once I got it, the results were quite exciting. Except, there were a couple of huge drawbacks...how to orient the next piece of fabric, and removing the paper. Regardless of the kind of paper I used, it still had to be removed at the end, which took as long or longer than the consturction of the quilt!

So, I started thinking about how to make paper piecing simpler and faster. And I'm proud to say that in 2004, I figured it out. My "Sirota No More Tears Paper Piecing"© method is easier to understand and takes at least half the time than the way paper piecing has been done traditionally.

My goals is to take the anxiety out of paper piecing and replace it with the joy of the process. Paper piecing is now fun, easy and quick.

JANUARY BLOCK OF THE MONTH—LAYER CAKE CUSTARD



Use I/4" seams and press as arrows indicate on diagram.

Cutting Fabric:

Cutting instructions for I Block: (Pieces already cut in your packet for 2 of these.) White or white-on-white or cream fabric

Cut five 4 1/2" squares


Cut one 1 1/2" x 13" rectangle


Cut two 1 1/2" x 6 1/4" rectangles

Color fabric —Cut four 4 1/2" squares


Block Assembly:


Assemble five white or white-on-white or beige fabric squares and four matching color squares into a Nine Patch Unit. Unit should measure 12 1/2" x 12 1/2".







2. Cut each Nine Patch Unit into four equal quarters. Custard Unit should measure 6 1/4" x 6 1/4".






TEXAS QUILT MUSEUM History in the Making

Our Winter 2021 Exhibits Celebrate a Centennial of Women's Suffrage and a Colorful Trifecta! LA GRANGE, TEXAS – December 17, 2020 – The U.S. Constitution and Color take center stage in the Texas Quilt Museum's winter exhibits Deeds Not Words: Celebrating 100 Years of Women's Suffrage and Red, White, & Blue. Both exhibits will run January 7-March 21, 2021.

In Deeds Not Words, Dr. Sandra Sider, Curator of the Texas Quilt Museum, and Pamela Weeks, Binney Family Curator of the New England Quilt Museum, collaborated to create a touring exhibition of studio art quilts to commemorate the 100th anniversary of the 19th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution, through which women won the right to vote in national elections. Twenty-nine award-winning artists from across the United States accepted the invitation to create 28 new works celebrating women's suffrage, along with one artist whose 1995 quilt on the 1848 Declaration of Sentiments is included. Subjects include many of the women who are famous for their work in the century-old fight for the vote, but several of the women the artists chose to commemorate are less well known but equally deserving of recognition. TEXAS QUILT MUSEUM History in the Making

The exhibition addresses racism in the Women's Suffrage Movement, depicting several heroic individuals. A comprehensive book containing full-page images of all the pieces with narrative artists' statements is available through Schiffer Publishing. The book is available for purchase at the Museum Store. *This exhibit is*

The Texas Quilt Museum salutes American patriotism with the rousing exhibition *Red, White, & Blue*. A total of 24 antique, vintage, and contemporary quilts from the Collection of International Quilt Festival celebrate our national flag.

While most people know that the stripes in the U.S. flag represent the 13 original Colonies and the stars the 50 states, the flag's color symbolism is not common knowledge.

White is meant to symbolize purity, with red symbolizing valor and hardiness, and blue symbolizing justice and perseverance—the last quality being tested for many months across America during the coronavirus pandemic.


Dr. Sider comments, "Patriotism can be defined as devotion for and attachment to one's homeland. What deeper attachment can we find than American quilts that contain the fabric of our nation's history? Even though not all the quilts in this exhibition have patriotic themes, they all stand proudly to celebrate our country." This exhibition is supported by the Lucille Gaebler Klein Fund.




Stars and Stripes (73" x 76") c. 1900, artist unknown. From the exhibit Red, White, & Blue.
