Minay Sirois—January 4th Speaker and Workshop

Minay has had a lifelong interest in history and fabric, and after nearly twenty years working and studying as an actress, she decided to begin a more practical career -- quiltmaking. It was a true passion for her, and she dove in headfirst. She has been happily immersed ever since.

Her quilting journey started in high school, when she began working on a twin-sized cathedral window coverlet. It **only** took her ten years to finish it. In the 1980's, she took quilting up seriously and quilted a few small pieces, finally getting her first "professional" commission when she was asked to design and make an original stencil-painted quilt for a friend -- a **king**-sized quilt.

After that, she designed and created original pieces on commission for some shops in Texas and Massachusetts, and began working at Great Expectations Quilt Shop in Houston. Eventually, she started teaching a few classes, and found that teaching quilting is something she really loves. She currently teaches at It's a Stitch Quilt Shop in Humble, Texas. Some of her classes cover basic quilting techniques, and others are project classes based on some of the quilts she has designed. She is also marketing some of her patterns through Black Cat Creations.

She has been presenting quilting programs and workshops at quilting guilds and bees throughout the Greater Houston and Southeast Texas area for a number of years.

Presentation - IT'S MY PANEL (AND I'LL TRY IF I WANT TO)

You have the panel, now what do you do with it? This workshop will look at the various types of panels available such as single border prints, large panels and multiple block panels. A show and tell will explore the various ways to use panels including quilts, bed runners, bell pulls and bags. Minay will also share her tips and tricks for working with these wonderful fabric works of art.

Workshop—The class will begin with a demonstration of a couple techniques she has found very useful as well as a tutorial on how to make a pieced border to fit your panel. The second part of the class will be a discussion and brainstorming session on how to use the panels you bring with you. Layouts will be explored and discussed and several handouts will be provided for future use. If you have never worked with panels, this is a great way to learn.

Required Supplies

- Panel or panels you are wanting to use along with support fabrics you may have already chosen. Panels and supporting fabric can be purchased at Quilters' Crossing in Tomball with guild members receive a 10% discount on all sales.
- Sewing machine and notions.

Topic—"Using Antique linens in your Quilts"

Bio -

As a 3rd generation quilter, I like to create! I enjoy the process of embellishing vintage embroidered pieces, longarm quilting, hand dying felted wool, needlework, ink dyes and occasionally crocheting and knitting. I enjoy searching through antique shops, flea markets and junk stores looking for vintage trims, buttons, needlework and linens.

I've been a featured artist in *On Track Magazine, Inspirations Magazine-*Facebook, *Embroiders' Guild of Victoria* (Canada) Facebook, *Hexie Love Magazine* and with artist Cindy Needham in the Special Exhibit *For the Love of Linens* at the International Quilt Festival (IQF) in Houston 2016 where additionally my hexagon piece *Second Chances* won 3rd Place in the Embellished Category, was on display at the Texas Quilt Museum, toured with Quilts Inc. and, on loan to the New England Quilt Museum, displayed mid Sept. through Dec. 31, 2017 as part of the Special Exhibit titled: Gilding the Lily. My vintage crochet flower piece titled *Basket of Flowers* was accepted by the IQA as a juried piece at the 2017 Houston IQF. This piece was also a featured work on Alex Anderson's The Quilt Show blog page. My quilt titled: *My Garden* took First Place, Best of Division and Best of Show at the Houston Livestock and Rodeo in 2017 as did *My Vintage Linens Quilt* in 2018. Most recently my *Vintage Handkerchiefs* quilt took a 3rd place ribbon at the MQX (Machine Quilters

Showcase) New England in the New Traditions in Textiles category and *Pink and Green Vintage Linens* Quilt took the 3rd place ribbon in the Springfield MQX, 2018. I was featured in Inspirations All Stitched Up Newsletter #169 published on 12/21/2018, 3 of my pieces were displayed.

2022 Kaleidoscope of Colors

Wow! What a fantastic turnout for quilt entries! We have over 250 quilts entered in our show this year which is so great to see. I appreciate everyone's patience while we all worked through switching to an online entry system this year. What may not be obvious is that in years past, literally every one of those was individually hand-typed into the now outdated program we had, which sat on one computer, which meant any changes were all done by one individual, during the Christmas rush. By streamlining this process, the quilt show team has more time to work on the other details for the show which means everyone wins.

Finally, for those of you who have entered a quilt, please let Barbara or Marietjie know the exact width and length of your quilt as soon as you know. Believe it or not, we track these down to the inch. Each pole that holds one or more quilts has to be rented, so the goal is always to maximize our space while minimizing our cost. If your quilt says on the form that is is 60" wide but it's really 61 and it's paired next to another quilt that is stated to be 60" but is really 61" wide...suddenly we have 122 inches of quilts and our poles can only go to 120" wide. Likewise, if your quilt is smaller, we might be able to move it to another pole that has space on it. The same is true for the length, particularly on smaller quilts where we may have 2 horizontal poles in the same draped area. If you know you will not finish your quilt in time for the show, we understand - things happen. But please let either Barbara or Marietjie know because Marietjie plans literally every square inch and if your quilt doesn't show up, there is literally a hole where she planned for your quilt to be, which not only is not aesthetically pleasing but it also creates a lot of extra work on Marietjie's part the day of the show when she is already very busy getting the quilts hung in the correct order.

BLOCK OF THE MONTH





January 2022 BOM
Tri County Quilt Guild
EZPZ Greek Cross
Block Name



This block is a an easy nine patch. There are HSTs in the corners and two strips sewn together on each side. Then you're ready to sew the block together! EZPZ

Cut: Yellow gold—I @ 4-1/2" square

4 @ 4-1/2" x 2-1/2" rectangles

Maroon—2 @ 5" squares

4 @ 4-1/2" x 2-1/2" rectangles

Dark Green—2 @ 5" squares



NOTE: All seams are sewn with a scant 1/4' seam allowance.

Directions: Draw a diagonal line from one corner to the opposite corner on the green fabric. With right sides together, place the green 5" square on top of the maroon 5" square. Sew a scant 1/4" line on each side of the drawn line. Cut on the drawn line. Press to set your seam and then open the unit up and press toward the green. Repeat with the other two 5" squares. Trim each HST to 4-1/2" square. Snip off the dog ears.

Take one yellow gold 4-1/2" x 2-1/2" strip and place right side down on a maroon piece of the same size matching all four sides. Sew a scant 1/4" seam along one long side. Set your seam and press the seam allowance toward the maroon. Repeat with the remaining pieces. Trim each unit to 4-1/2" square.

Arrange units as shown on the right.



BLOCK OF THE MONTH



Sew row one together pressing seam allowances to the center.

Sew row two together pressing seam allowances to the outside.

Sew row three together pressing seam allowances to the center.

Sew the rows together and press seam allowances to the center.

This what the finished block looks like.



Give the block a good press and trim to 12 1/2" square.




