### February BLOCK OF THE MONTH—



February 2021 BOM Tri County Quilt Guild Zig Zag Path

This is a simple 12 1/2" block with eight half square triangle (HST) units and one plain square in the center.

#### Cut:

From green: 1—4 1/2" x 4 1/2" square (Set this block aside until final assembly of the 12 1/2" block) 2—5 " x 5" squares

From plum: 3 - 5" x 5" squares

From white:  $3 - 5'' \times 5''$  squares

#### **Directions:**

Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of the three white squares.

The photo on the right is just for reference and shows what units you should have before cutting on the drawn lines. (I've included it ahead of the directions so you can see where you'll end up.)



Place one plum and one white 5" square with right sides together. Stitch a line a scant 1/4' on each side of the drawn line. Repeat for 1 more pair of plum and white squares. You will have 1 plum 5" square left at this time. Cut down the drawn line on each pair. Set your seams and press towards the plum on each half square triangle (HST) unit. You should now have 4 plum and white HST units.

Place one green 5" square and the 1 remaining white square with right sides together. Stitch a line a scant 1/4' on each side of the drawn line. Cut down the drawn line. Set your seams and press towards the green on each HST unit. You should have 2 green and white HST units. (There should be one green 5" square and the green 4 1/2" square remaining.)

### February BLOCK OF THE MONTH—

Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of the remaining plum 5"square. Place the remaining green 5" square and this plum square with right sides together. Stitch a line a scant 1/4" on each side of the drawn line. Cut down the drawn line. Set your seams and press towards the green on each half square triangle unit. You should now have 2 green and plum HST units.

Square all 8 HST units to 4 1/2".



This photo shows all eight HST units when finished.

You are now ready to assemble the block. Refer to the photo on the right for the Block layout.





Sew row one together pressing seams in one direction. Sew row two together with the green 4 1/2' square in the middle. Press seams in the opposite direction of row one. Sew row three together pressing seams in the same direction as row one.

Sew all three rows together. Press seams in either direction.


Give the block a good press and trim to 12 1/2" square.

Our Winter 2021 Exhibits Celebrate a Centennial of Women's Suffrage and a Colorful Trifecta! LA GRANGE, TEXAS – December 17, 2020 – The U.S. Constitution and Color take center stage in the Texas Quilt Museum's winter exhibits Deeds Not Words: Celebrating 100 Years of Women's Suffrage and Red, White, & Blue. Both exhibits will run January 7-March 21, 2021.

In Deeds Not Words, Dr. Sandra Sider, Curator of the Texas Quilt Museum, and Pamela Weeks, Binney Family Curator of the New England Quilt Museum, collaborated to create a touring exhibition of studio art quilts to commemorate the 100th anniversary of the 19th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution, through which women won the right to vote in national elections. Twenty-nine award-winning artists from across the United States accepted the invitation to create 28 new works celebrating women's suffrage, along with one artist whose 1995 guilt on the 1848 Declaration of Sentiments is included. Subjects include many of the women who are famous for their work in the century-old fight for the vote, but several of the women the artists chose to commemorate are less well known but equally deserving of recognition. # TEXAS UILT MUSEUM History in the Making



The exhibition addresses racism in the Women's Suffrage Movement, depicting several heroic individuals. A comprehensive book containing full-page images of all the pieces with narrative artists' statements is available through Schiffer Publishing. The book is available for purchase at the Museum Store. *This exhibit is* 



sponsored exclusively by eQuilter.com, with additional assistance from Museum co-founders Karey Bresenhan and Nancy O'Bryant Puentes.

Dr. Sider with the *Deeds Not Words* book. The Texas Quilt Museum salutes American patriotism with the rousing exhibition **Red**, **White**, **& Blue**. A total of 24 antique, vintage, and contemporary quilts from the Collection of International Quilt Festival celebrate our national flag.

While most people know that the stripes in the U.S. flag represent the 13 original Colonies and the stars the 50 states, the flag's color symbolism is not common knowledge.

White is meant to symbolize purity, with red symbolizing valor and hardiness, and blue symbolizing justice and perseverance—the last quality being tested for many months across America during the coronavirus pandemic.

Dr. Sider comments, "Patriotism can be defined as devotion for and attachment to one's homeland. What deeper attachment can we find than American quilts that contain the fabric of our nation's history? Even though not all the quilts in this exhibition have patriotic themes, they all stand proudly to celebrate our country." *This exhibition is supported by the Lucille Gaebler Klein Fund.* 





We need flannel for the HUGS we donate. Please put that on your shopping list when you are buying fabric.


If you have blending fabric (white, white-on-white, beige, etc.), please donate some of your stash. Block of the Month projects really needs it.


# **Donations Needed**
