Tsukineko Inks, Fabrico Fabric Markers

Tsykineko All-Purpose Inks (API Inks) are Japanese traditional kimono printing inks. It is absolutely child-safe and absolutely archival. It is machine washable and dryable. They work on any kind of porous surface, from fabric (muslin, cotton, silk, poly, wool), to paper, wood, and even leather.

The inks are water-based and can be mixed with different media - including water, aloe vera gel, shaving cream, starch, and rubbing alcohol.

For beginners level - like kindergarten kids, they can mix with shaving cream to use for marble, tie-dye, or background coloring.

For intermediate level - they can be used with stencils, rubber stamps, or any other tools to create printed patterns on fabric or paper.

For advanced level -

You can use any techniques you know from a watercolor painting or oil painting to working with inks to paint portraits or landscaping.

Block of the Month



April 2022 BOM Rail Fence Tri County Quilt Guild



Whatever you do—-PLEASE don't tell my former math students how easy I make it for you to join in on the Block of the Month fun! They would track me down and torment me for the rest of my life! Those poor kids had to work hard in my class!!!

Cut:

From Yellow—4 strips 2" x 7"

From Light Blue—4 strips 2" x 7"

From Print-4 strips 2" x 7"

From Rosy Pink-4 strips 2" x 7"



NOTE: All seams are sewn with a scant 1/4' seam allowance.

Directions:

Arrange each group of 4 fabrics as shown on the right.

NOTE the orientation of the print fabric.

(The houses "sit" on the dotted fabric.

Stitch each group of strips together and press seam allowances down toward the rosy pink fabric.

Give the unit a good press and square each unit to 6-1/2".

(There is a bit of extra length on the strips.)



Arrange the 4 units as shown on the left.

Stitch row I together and press seam allowance to the right.



Stich row 2 together and press seam allowance to the left. Sew row 1 to row 2 and press to the long rosy pink edge.

Block of the Month



Give the block a good press and trim to 12 1/2" square. EZPZ! You're done!!!


