Colors: Blue Sky with scrappy brown/beige mountains

Cutting: (Your kit already has these pieces cut) This is a great pattern for fat quarters.

Blue Sky: Cut one 10 7/8" square of blue
Mountain: Cut one 10 7/8" square of brown/beige

## BLUE SKY MOUNTAIN BLOCK



## LET'S GO PIECE THIS BLOCK

FIRST: Start with two contrasting $107 / 8 "$ squares of fabric and place them right sides together. Draw a diagonal line from one corner to the other corner. Pin the edges and sew a scant $1 / 4$ " away from both sides of the center diagonal line. Cut along the diagonal line and you will obtain two half square triangles (HST). Press both HSTs open. Each block measures a $10 \frac{1}{2} "$ square. Trim off the dog ears on the corners. Spray starch to stabilize the fabric more.


SECOND: Place each HST on your cutting mat and make sure they mirror each other to make that mountain-see above. (This step is very important, or you will end up with two blocks exactly the same and you can't make the mountain) Mark each square in four vertical strips which will measure $25 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ for each strip. Cut on each line. Invert and move each strip so the mountain looks like the second picture below. Sew each strip together using a scant $1 / 4 "$ seam allowance. Press all seams going in the same direction,


THIRD: This pattern will make two blocks that are finished at $10 \frac{1}{2} " \mathrm{x} 9 "$. Do not sew the blocks together because the person winning these blocks can make the decision to sew the same fabric together or maybe put with other blocks to make a scrappy quilt. There are many arrangement options, a few of which are shown below.


Let's get creative and dig into those scraps that you have and use a light blue for the sky and all sorts of browns, beiges and golden browns for the mountains. These blocks will make a gorgeous scrappy mountain quilt. The possibilities are endless.


As always, we strive to have blocks that turn out all the same size so when they are pieced together, they all match. All seams are $1 / 4$ ". Using a scant $1 / 4$ " seam helps to maintain the integrity of the block size.

## Colors: NAVY, WHITE, \& NAVY/WHITE PRINT

## Cutting: (Your kit already has these pieces cut)

Solid Navy Fabric-
Cut 4-3" $\times 51 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles
Cut 4-3" squares
Cut 2-5" squares
Print Navy/White Fabric-
Cut 2-5" squares
White Fabric-
Cut 2-5" squares
Cut I-3" square


## LET'S GO PIECE THIS BLOCK!

## Piecing:

We are going to learn a method for making 4 HSTs at a time. For this block we will need 4 HST in 3 different combinations.


FIRST: Take the 5 " squares and place right sides together as follows: (navy/white, print/white, \& navy/print.

Pin on all 4 sides of each set and sew a $1 / 4$ " seam around each of the units. (Note: at this point I sprayed starch on each unit to help keep it from stretching.)


You will then make 2 diagonal cuts on each unit to form 4 HSTs per unit.


Please note the HST units are cut on the bias \& will stretch very easily \& become distorted. Open each HST and lightly press seam towards the darker fabric. I have made an allowance in the initial measurements so you can true-up your HST to an accurate 3" square after sewing \& pressing. Place your 45-degree line on your ruler on the diagonal line of the square and trim to 3 " square. You will end up with 3 different sets of 4 HST. This method is a lot better than doing them one at a time. Don't you think? ".


SECOND: Make 4-patch units using a solid 3" navy square and one each of the different HST blocks. Place the 3 " squares in the order shown below. Sew together the top two squares and then the bottom two squares. Press the seams in opposite directions and sew those sections together, matching center seams. Make them mirror images of each other and make 2 of each.


Finished bock measures $12.75^{\prime \prime}$.

THIRD: Arrange the 4-patch units in 2 rows with a navy 3"x5 I/2" rectangle between using mirror images of each 4 -patch. Arrange a center row with the navy 3 "x5 I/2" rectangles on either side of the center 3" white square. Sew each row together as shown. Then sew all rows together , matching seam lines, to finish the block.
