

### TSC DESIGNS Company



Tom is a computer engineer and Joyce is a pharmacist. She taught pharmacology in medical school.

Both of them quit their jobs around 1990 and started Teacher Stamp Company, educational supply businesses,

For 30 years, they distributed, developed, and played with Japanese TSUKINEKO Inks for fiber and paper art under the TSC DESIGNS company.

Tsukineko Inks, Fabrico Fabric Markers

Tsykineko All-Purpose Inks (API Inks) are Japanese traditional kimono printing inks. It is absolutely child-safe and absolutely archival. It is machine washable and dryable. They work on any kind of porous surface, from fabric (muslin, cotton, silk, poly, wool), to paper, wood, and even leather.

The inks are water-based and can be mixed with different media - including water, aloe vera gel, shaving cream, starch, and rubbing alcohol.

For beginners level - like kindergarten kids, they can mix with shaving cream to use for marble, tie-dye, or background coloring.

For intermediate level - they can be used with stencils, rubber stamps, or any other tools to create printed patterns on fabric or paper.

For advanced level -

You can use any techniques you know from a watercolor painting or oil painting to working with inks to paint portraits or landscaping.

### June 7—Lou Ann Nichols


Hi All!! I am Lou Ann Nichols and a happy quilter living in Montgomery, Texas along with my husband, Allen and our pets Rosie and Buttons. We have one daughter, Emily who is married to a wonderful man, Trey and two sweet grandchildren, Rylee and Garrett, who live in Houston.

My quilting adventure started in 1973 with my first pieced quilt for my wedding taught to me by my soon to be Mother in law, Viola in which we used a piece of 4 I/2 "cardboard to put together a fun quilt using every type fabric she had in her scrap box. Then in 1987, I took up the hobby seriously and have been piecing ever since. After leaving the corporate world in 2009, I bought my first long arm quilting machine from A-I and then in 2017 upgraded to a Handi Quilter Fusion long arm with a pro sticher which I just love. My initial interest in long arming was just to quilt for myself, but then as the story goes, I started quilting for the public in 2011 doing edge to edge and playing with custom only for myself. I have won many awards on my quilts and have had two Paradise in Bloom and Vintage Rose at the International Quilt Show in Houston and Chicago with one of them, Vintage Rose, being displayed at the Texas Quilt Museum in La Grange, TX also. These Judy Niemeyer quilts were pieced by me and quilted by Valerie Wagner.

For the last 2 years I have been teaching the 2 fabric Bargello quilts featuring the Susie Weaver pattern of the same name all over Texas and having a ball meeting a lot of fun quilters!

### **Block of the Month**





May 2022 BOM
Tri County Quilt Guild
Basketweave Block
Block Name



Another EZPZ block! The traditional Basketweave pattern is made with strip units that you trim to the given length, then sew the four units together and Bam! You're finished!

Cut: Yellow—3 strips 2-1/2' x 14"


Blue & yellow floral—3 strips 2-1/2' x 14"

NOTE: All seams are sewn with 1/4" scant seam allowance!



#### Directions:

Sew three strips sets together. One set is to be blue floral, yellow, blue floral. The other set is yellow, blue floral, yellow a shown on the right. Each strip set should finish at 6-1/2' x 14'. If they're not 6-1/2' wide, adjust your seam allowance.





Arrange the units as shown on the left.



Sew row one together.

Sew row two together.

These two units should be  $6-1/2" \times 12-1/2"$  each.

Matching the intersection in the middle, sew row one to row two. This is the only place you need to match seams!

### Block of the Month



Give the block a good press and trim to 12 1/2" square. You're finished!!!





### Charity Bee & Community Service Bees



Callling all Tri-County Quilt Guild Members...

Our Charity Bee quilts are in desperate need of you. We have approximately 25 bins of quilt bundles (that is approximately 175 quilts) that need to be quilted.

If every member would take one bundle and quilt it, that would really help fulfill our need for quilts.

Now, for those of you that don't have a longarm, approximately, 20% of those 175 quilts (that is 35 quilts) can be quilted on a domestic sewing machine using a walking foot and decorative stitch. If you are a beginner quilter, one of those 35 quilts has your name on it. There is no expectation these numbers will ever change...so rest assured there will always be a bundle for you.

I have linked below some YouTube videos of quilting decorative stitches with a walking foot. Please take some time to view these videos, maybe practice on one or two squares of fabric and then dive in. These quilts are not "SHOW QUILTS". These quilts are given to recipients who don't care if the stitching design is perfect...just if the quilt will last their lifetime.

The two reasons I joined the guild are because I wanted to learn how to piece better and learn how to guilt my own guilt. With practice, I have learned both AND you can too.

Thanks for taking the time to read this. Every Wednesday, I will be parked in the Fairfield Baptist Church at 27240 US 290, Cypress, TX parking lot in front of the side door. To remind everyone, this is where the guild usually meets for meetings.


