#### JUNE BLOCK OF THE MONTH—BEAR'S

Since we have not been able to meet in a while, I will be delivering April's Blue Sky Mountain Block kits along with this month's kits to Janet Winkler for you to stop by her home and pick them up, and also turn in the blocks you have already sewn. Her address is 14730 Waynewood, Cypress, Tx. <u>Please email or phone ahead of</u> <u>time to make sure kits are still available. Her phone number is 281-</u> <u>373-3434.</u>

This month's Bear's Paw quilt block is a classic. A single quilt block requires 16 half square triangles (HSTs). The design lends itself well to the 8 at a time HST method. This method is a more efficient use of your time and extremely accurate.

<u>General Instructions</u>: We will be making a finished 14" block. All seams will be a scant 1/4". Press as noted in the pictures. When you are instructed to press, first press the pieced unit to set the seam. Then open the patch, pressing from the front. I recommend starching your quilt fabric before cutting to increase your stitching accuracy. The HST units are cut oversized and are trimmed to size after stitching.

#### Step One—Cut the fabric (the kit has the cut pieces)

Fabric A (Bright contrasting colors)

Cut 2 squares 6 1/4" x 6 1/4" Cut 4 squares 4/1/2" x 4 1/2" Cut 1 square 2/1/2" x 2 1/2"

Fabric B Background Fabric (Beige) Cut 2 squares 6 1/4" x 6 1/4" Cut 4 rectangles 2 1/2" x 6 1/2" Cut 4 squares 2/1/2" x 2 1/2"




#### Step Two—Make the HST units

Start by constructing the HST units. Take a 6 1/4" x 6 1/4" square of both Fabric A & B. On the background fabric draw a diagonal line between both pairs of corners. Place them right sides together and pin on four sides. With your favorite quarter inch foot installed on your sewing machine, stitch a 1/4" away from both sides of each diagonal line. Repeat for the other set and you have stitched a total of 16 HSTs. Isn't that pretty cool?




After sewing the unmarked side looks like this.



## Block of the Month

Now it is time to cut this into the units. Place the sewn unit on your cutting mat, marked side up. Find the midpoint for the block—it's 3 1/8". Align your ruler with the midpoint and cut through the center of the drawn X. Now rotate your mat a quarter turn and find the midpoint and cut again. You've now cut your patches into four 3 1/8" squares. Now cut along each of the drawn diagonal lines. Repeat for the other square and you will have...voila!! 16 HSTs.




Press and trim to 2 1/2" squares. If you don't have a Bloc-Loc ruler, get



### Step Three—Assemble the corner units

To create the corner sections, stitch four of each of the 2 different units shown below. It is easy to get things discombobulated when you sew these units together. I like to sew one and then keep it by my machine as I piece the others together. With right sides together, sew a pair of the HSTs to the 2 1/2" square of Fabric B and press in the direction of the arrow for a total of four sets. Pressing the seam allowances as suggested makes it easy to see where your seam touches the point of the triangle. To finish your corners, add the remaining sub-units as shown below. Press your seam allowances toward the 4 1/2" square. Now this is starting to look like a bear's paw.



### Step Four—Assemble the Bear's Paw Quilt Block

Arrange the sewn corners and the Fabric B 2 1/2" x 6 1/2" rectangles along with the Fabric A 2 1/2" square as follows. Sew them together in rows and press the seam allowances on the first and third rows toward the center. Press the seam allowances on the second row to the outside. Join the rows together, pinning to match up the seams.

One final press and your Bear's Paw quilt block is complete! It should measure at 14 1/2".


### Helping Hands Bags and Teen Life HUGS
