The MELLOW YELLOW quilt block came about in a funny way. I was browsing Pinterest and a lady posted a picture of a block that she had sewn incorrectly, but it turned out pretty cool. I don't even know what it was originally supposed to look like. I did not have a pattern, so I decided to experiment and came up with this. I started out calling it the double bow tie, then my husband said he saw Sulphur butterflies and I finally settled on Mellow Yellow. Don't ask me why. You can call yours whatever you like.

This easy quilt block consists of 8 rectangles with a square sewed on each end. Pretty simple, right?

Cutting Instructions: (Pieces already cut in your packet)

Black Print – Cut four $6\frac{1}{2}'' \times 3\frac{1}{2}''$ rectangles

Gray Print – Cut four $6\frac{1}{2}'' \times 3\frac{1}{2}''$ rectangles

Cut four $3\frac{1}{2}''$ squares



Yellow Print – Cut four $3\frac{1}{2}''$ squares





Finished size $12'' \times 12''$

LET'S GO PIECE THIS BLOCK! All seams are a scant $\frac{1}{4}''$.

First – (1) On the four gray $3\frac{1}{2}''$ squares, draw a diagonal line from corner to corner. Place the gray $3\frac{1}{2}''$ squares on one end of the black $3\frac{1}{2}'' \times 6\frac{1}{2}''$ rectangles. Note the direction of the diagonal line shown below. (2) Stitch on the line and trim the seam to $\frac{1}{4}''$. (3) Press the seam toward the black fabric.




Second – (1) On the four yellow $3\frac{1}{2}''$ squares, draw a diagonal line from corner to corner. Place the yellow $3\frac{1}{2}''$ squares on one end of the gray $3\frac{1}{2}'' \times 6\frac{1}{2}''$ rectangles. Note the direction of the diagonal line shown below. The direction of the diagonal line is opposite of the one stitched above. (2) Stitch on the line and trim the seam to $\frac{1}{4}''$. (3) Press the seam toward the yellow fabric.





Third – Lay out all of the rectangles in the order shown.



Fourth – (1) Stitch the top row together using a scant $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam and making sure to match the seams. If you pressed your seams in the direction stated above, they should nest together nicely. **Note:** If you put a drop of Elmer's School Glue where you are matching your seams and using a dry iron press it, it will stay in place while you stitch and not slip like it might with pins. Press all the seams to the left. **(2)** Stitch the bottom row together using a scant $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam and making sure to match the seams. These seams should nest together also. Press all the seams to the right.

Last, sew the top row to the bottom row using a scant $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam , matching the seams and press seam open to reduce bulk. Your block should measure $12\frac{1}{2}$ " unfinished.

HAPPY QUILTING!



ATTENTION: Since we have not been able to meet in a while, the last 3 month's kits, along with this month's kits, will be delivered to Quilters Crossing in Tomball for you to stop by and pick up. When you do this, also turn in the blocks you have already sewn since January.
