Nancy Prince, an award winning quilt artist from Orlando, FL, specializes in thread painting. She has authored two books, has appeared on The Quilt Show with Alex Anderson and her quilts have appeared in numerous magazines. Nancy's quilts have won numerous awards the most prestigious being the 2014 Best of Show at the International Quilt Festival in Houston the 2015 Best of World Show at Mancuso's Quilt World in New England and the Marie White Masterpiece award at Road to California. . Her quilts have also won 8 other Best of Show awards at other events and 20 Viewers' Choice awards throughout the years. Other awards include Best Pictorial, Artistic Merit and Best Wall Quilt just to name a few. In addition to onsite workshops and lectures Nancy now offers virtual workshops to shows and guilds and @Home with Nancy which are Open Enrollment workshops that anyone can sign up for.

Workshop Description: This workshop briefly introduces you to both thread painting and thread sketching. A preprinted design easily guides you through each step to assure your success right from the start. You will be amazed how a straight and zigzag stitch creates magic right before your eyes. All aspects of each design are demoed via camera and projector so it is almost like having a private lesson with me. So come see how easy the process is and how much fun creating designs in thread can be. !

Workshop – October 6

Starting with Silk

6 hours


Many of us have silk treasures from trips abroad, neckties or prom dresses that are too special to cut up so we leave them tucked away in a drawer or box. It's time to get them out and make something beautiful!

This workshop has three elements: You'll begin by determining the fiber content of your fabrics by using the burn test. We will then cover two very different ways to work with silk: First, a very free, improvisational piecing technique I call 'Pieces, Pairs and Panels' and second, a foundation piecing method that gives stability and ultra-precise results, even with the lightest weight silks.

Working with your stash, you'll construct elements in these two techniques that can be combined into a small, pillow-sized finished piece.

Hello everyone! I hope you're enjoying your summer. One of the groups I'm in currently has a challenge to sew something, anything for 15 minutes every day. What a great way to sneak in some "me" time every day and have something to show for it at the end of the week!

We are making a lot of great progress on our 2022 quilt show and can't wait to see all of you at the Berry Center on March 4th and 5th. We have quite a few vendors already signed up, but we do have some booths still available. If you are interested in being a vendor at our show or know someone who is please let them know we would love to talk to them.

While some of our vendors are quilt-related, we also have a wide variety of items and services that will be available. The cost per booth is \$300. Additional amenities such as electricity and extra chairs and tables are available for a small fee. Vendors can also rent multiple booths if they prefer, which we will keep together in one space (unless you prefer to split them up of course).

In addition, the rule for the deadline to join our guild to enter a quilt into the show has been revised. Thanks to our trusty president with the eagle eye, we discovered the bylaws read dues must be paid "in the month of" October and not by the October meeting. That's great news for anyone who needs a little extra time that month to join, such as new members. The website has been updated to reflect the deadline for membership is now October 31st and it's also been posted on the Facebook group. If you weren't in attendance at our August meeting, then you missed the first official unveiling of our raffle quilt. We had a lot of great feedback about how beautiful it is. With so many talented people in our guild who did the sewing, applique work, quilting, and also the binding it is sure to be a great fundraiser for us. The ticket prices are the same as in previous years; 1 ticket for \$1 or if you buy 5 or more tickets you get a bonus ticket for every additional 5th ticket that you buy. I.e., 6 tickets for \$5, 12 tickets for \$10, and so forth. While we are not allowed to sell raffle tickets online due to the Texas state law regarding games of chance, we are happy to sell you tickets directly. Please get in touch with either Janice Toler who is heading up everything related to the raffle quilt, or you can always reach out to me (Barbara Boone) or my co-chair Debbie Kelton and we will be happy to get tickets to you.

If you are interested in entering a quilt in the show but perhaps not up to a large quilt, don't forget that one of our categories are mini quilts. I always enjoy those because they don't take very long to add the binding! And for those of you who enjoy quilting but aren't interested in the competition side of it, we do have the "display only" category which is perfect for a no-stress way to showcase your hard work!

MEMBERSHIP RENEWAL

It is time to RENEW your MEMBERSHIP! Because of the quilt show coming up in March 2022, if you wish to enter a quilt, you MUST renew your membership BY OCTOBER 31st. This is different from what we said in the August meeting. After much discussion, the officers decided to extend the deadline for renewal to the end of October instead of making it the October meeting. There are a number of ways you can renew your membership:

Renew online at TriCountyQuiltGuild.org. Here, you can either pay online using a credit card (there is a small convenience fee associated with this) or pay in-person at our next meeting or mail me a check.

Download the form from the old website ([HERE](#)). Fill it out, mail it with your check to the address on the form.

Renew in person at the next meeting by filling out our standard form and paying with cash, check or credit card. (Again there is a convenience fee for using a credit card.)

September 2021 BOM
Tri County Quilt Guild
Spinner Block
Block Name



This block will go together quickly for you! You just have 1 HST, 1 square and 1 rectangle in each of four identical units.

Cut:

- Navy—2 squares @ 4"
 4 rectangles @ 3-1/2" x 6-1/2"
- Floral—2 squares @ 4"
 4 squares @ 3-1/2"



Directions:

To make the four half square triangles, draw a diagonal on the back of each of the two floral 4" squares. Place one floral 4" square face down on a navy 4" square and stitch a scant 1/4" seam on each side of the diagonal line you drew. Cut along the diagonal and press to set the seam. Then press the seam allowance to the navy side. You should have four HSTs. Square each HST to 3-1/2".


Following the example to the left, sew one HST to a floral 3-1/2" square so the navy part of the HST is next to the floral square. Press to set the seam and then press the seam allowance to the floral side. Then sew the navy rectangle on. Press to set the seam and then press the seam allowance to the navy rectangle. Trim the unit to 6-1/2" square.

Your finished unit should look like the photo on the right.
 Repeat so that you've made four units just alike.





Arrange the four units as shown on the right.



Sew row one together, pressing seam allowance to the tall navy rectangle (to the right).

Sew row two together, pressing seam allowance to the tall navy rectangle (to the left).

Sew row one to row two and press seam allowance toward row one.

Give your block a good press and trim to 12-1/2".

You're finished!



If you would, please return the plastic bag your block kit came in so we can reuse it.


