OCTOBER BLOCK OF THE MONTH-LADY OF



My research on this month's quilt block, Lady of the Lake, said it was apparently named after a poem by Sir Walter Scott, published in 1810. The pioneer men and women loved the tales of Sir Walter Scott and the women honored him by naming a patchwork block after the poem. The quilt block appeared shortly after publication of the poem. Apparently it is one of the few quilt block patterns that has never been known by other names. It consists of 8 half square triangles (HSTs), I larger and 7 smaller.

<u>General Instructions</u>: We will be making an unfinished 12 1/2" block. All seams will be a scant 1/4". Press as noted in the directions. When you are instructed to press, first press the pieced unit to set the seam. Then open the patch, pressing from the front. I recommend starching your quilt fabric before cutting to increase your stitching accuracy. The HST units are cut slightly oversized and are trimmed to size after stitching.

Step One—Cut the fabric (the kit has the cut pieces)

Fabric A (Prints-Blues-Shades of water)

Cut I square at 9 7/8"

Cut I square at 8"

Fabric B (Background Fabric-Cream)

Cut I square at 9 7/8"



Step Two—Make the Half Sqiuare Triangle units


(1.) Start by constructing the small HST units. Take an 8" square of both Fabric A & B. On the wrong side of the background fabric B draw a diagonal line between both pairs of corners. Place them right sides together and pin on four sides. With your favorite quarter inch foot installed on your sewing machine, stitch a scant 1/4" away from both sides of each diagonal line. (2.) After sewing it looks like this.



(3.) Now it is time to cut this into the units. Place the sewn unit on your cutting mat, marked side up. Find the midpoint for the block—it's 4". Align your ruler with the midpoint and cut through the center of the drawn X. Now rotate your mat a quarter turn and find the midpoint and cut again. You've now cut your patches into four 4" squares. (4.) Now cut along each of the drawn diagonal lines. You will have 8 HSTs. You will only need to use 7 of these. Return the extra HST and we can use it in a border. (5.) Press to the dark side and trim to 3 1/2" squares. If you don't have a Bloc-Loc ruler, get you one. They are great for squaring up HSTs and come in different sizes.




Step Three—Assemble the large HST unit

(1.) To create the large HST, take the 9 7/8" square of both Fabric A & B. On the wrong side of the background fabric B draw one diagonal line from corner to corner. Place them right sides together and pin on four sides. (2.) Stitch a scant 1/4" away from both sides of the diagonal line. After sewing it looks like this. (3.) Cut apart on the diagonal line. (4.) Press to the dark side. This makes two large HSTs. We will only use one for this block. Trim to 9 1/2" square.



Step Four—Assemble the Lady in the Lake Quilt Block

(1.) Assemble the three small HST units as shown below. Pay attention to the direction the units are facing. Press the seams downward. (2.) Sew the small 3 HST unit to the large HST unit. Make sure to use a scant 1/4" seam as to not cut the points off when sewn. The unit should now measure 9 1/2" x 12 1/2". (3.) Sew the bottom four small HST units together. Paying attention to the direction they are laid out. Press seams to the left. (4.) Sew these to the bottom of the previous block and press the seam towards the block. You should now have a block that measures 12 1/2". This block is usually sewn set "on point".






