Your Guild Needs You

Tri-County Quilt Guild has openings for 2021. No previous experience necessary. We need someone to serve as Secretary, Junior Program Chair, Block of the Month Chair, Hospitality Chair, and Community Service Chair. Below is a brief description of each position.

<u>Secretary</u>—Take the minutes of the monthly Guild and Board meetings. Type the minutes and retain copies for the guild's files.

<u>Junior Program Chair</u>—work with the senior program chair to locate and sign up speakers for monthly guild meetings. The junior program chair will become the senior program chair the following year.

<u>Block of the Month</u>—Select a block for members to create from their own stash or one of the kits. Cut and bag approximately ten sets of fabric for block and sign out to members at meeting. Present block at each meeting and write directions to create the block for publishing in the monthly newsletter.

<u>Hospitality Chair</u>—meet and greet visitors and new members to our guild meetings. Help them become familiar with everything our guild has to offer magazines sales, show and tell, door prizes, etc. Also send sympathy and get well cards to members.

<u>Community Service Chair</u>—act as a liaison between the guild and the contact person for Open Net. Make the guild aware of the needs of Open Net. These are generally food items that members bring to guild meeting. You do not deliver or load these items. There is a drop off area at the church and the items will be collected Open Net.

More information on the duties of each position are described under the "Duties of the Executive Board" and "Duties of Standing Chairs". These can be located on the blog under Membership and Forms. The good news is that we have now created detailed step-by-step guides for each position. Our guild really needs your involvement to continue running smoothly. Please consider helping. Most of these positions can be shared with another member if you aren't sure you want to take on the entire responsibility yourself. We'd love to get some new faces involved or old faces to fill new positions.

NOVEMBER BLOCK OF THE MONTH - DISAPPEARING NINE-PATCH



Quilts made with disappearing blocks are intriguing. I have been wanting to try one to see what it was all about. You start with a simple block such as a Four-Patch, Nine-Patch or Pinwheel. Then you carefully slice it into sections and rearrange the sections to give the block an entirely new look. It seems the options are almost endless. This month we are going to be starting with a nine-patch.

<u>Cutting Instructions:</u> (Pieces already cut in your packet) <u>Dark Red</u> – Cut one 4 1/2" squares

Medium Red - Cut four 4 1/2" squares


Tan (Background) - Cut four 4 1/2" squares

LET'S GO PIECE THIS BLOCK! All seams are a scant 1/4".

Unfinished size || 3/4" x || 3/4"

<u>First</u> – (1) Place all of the 4 1/2" squares in the order shown below. The dark red square is the center and the four medium red squares are placed in the corners with the tan squares placed in between (2) Sew the top row together and press seams toward the medium red squares. Sew the middle row together and press seams toward the center red square. (3) Sew the top row to the middle row, the seams should nest together to line up. Press the seam toward the middle row. Next sew the bottom row to the middle row, the seams will nest together to line up. Press the seam toward the middle row. Your nine-patch is now finished and should measure 12 1/2".

<u>Second</u> – Now let's transform this ordinary nine-patch into something new. (4) Find the middle of the block, it should be 6 1/4" in from the left side. Make a vertical cut down the middle. Don't move the fabric and next find the horizontal middle of the block, again it should be about 6 1/4" from the bottom. Make a horizontal cut across the middle. You now have 4 cut sections. (5). Take the top right section and rotate it 180 degrees. Rotate the bottom left section 180 degrees also. This block is now a four-patch.





Block of the Month

<u>Third</u> – Take the top two sections and sew them together. Press the seam to the right side. Next sew the bottom two sections together and press the seam to the left side. Finally, sew the top section to the bottom section matching seams which should be nested together. Your block is now finished. Once all the blocks are laid out together, you will see secondary designs appear. There are so many ways to slice and dice different blocks. Have fun with them.






