

DECEMBER BLOCK OF THE MONTH - JEWEL BOX





Jewel Box quilts are made from multiple 4-block groups and are usually sewn with vibrant jewel-tone fabrics such as in the Gemstones shown at the end of these instructions. These are usually set against a contrasting dark background, often black. Each unit is made up of 2 four patches and 2 half square triangles. Make 4 of these units and sew them together to make one big beautiful block.

<u>Cutting Instructions for 1 block:</u> (Pieces already cut in your packet for 2 of these)

Black - Cut four 3" x 3" squares

Cut one 5 7/8" x 5 7/8" square

lewel-Tone Fabrics -

Cut four 3" x 3" squares from at least two

different fabrics.


Cut one 5 7/8" x 5 7/8" square, cut two to go scrappy




The block unit should measure 10 1/2" square


LET'S GO PIECE THIS BLOCK! All seams are a scant 1/4".


First – Make 2 four patch units. (1) Sew a 3" x 3" jewel square to one side of a black square of the same size. Press seam allowances toward the black square. Repeat to make 3 more jewel/black units. (2) Sew two of the units together to make a four patch placing blacks on the diagonal from each other and butting seam allowances together for the perfect match. Press new seam allowance in either direction. Repeat to make a second four patch unit. The four patch should measure a 5 1/2" square.






<u>Second</u> – Make 2 half square triangle (HST) units. (1) Pair a 5 7/8" black square with a jewel square the same size. Draw a diagonal line from one corner to the opposite corner on the reverse side of the lightest square. (2) Place the squares right sides together and sew two seams, each a scant 1/4" from the center diagonal line. Cut through both layers on the marked center diagonal line. (3) Open up and press seams to the dark side. Trim off dog ears. These should measure a 5 1/2" square.









<u>Third</u> – (1) Arrange all units into a square as illustrated below. Placing the two HST units on opposite corners with the black facing the center. Place the two four patch units in the other opposite corners with the colored squares going down the center to form a chain. (2) Sew the top two units together and then sew the bottom two units together to make two rows. Press toward the HST side. (3) Next sew the bottom row to the top row matching the center seam.

Think of all these jewel tone colors when you make your own blocks. Very pretty set against a black background. When you put 4 blocks together it forms a diamond in the middle with the chain surrounding it.




