

June 7, 2022 — Lou Ann Nichols

Hi All!! I am Lou Ann Nichols and a happy quilter living in Montgomery, Texas along with my husband, Allen and our pets Rosie and Buttons. We have one daughter, Emily who is married to a wonderful man, Trey and two sweet grandchildren, Rylee and Garrett, who live in Houston.

My quilting adventure started in 1973 with my first pieced quilt for my wedding taught to me by my soon to be mother in law, Viola, in which we used a piece of 4 I/2 "cardboard to put together a fun quilt using every type of fabric she had in her scrap box. Then in 1987, I took up the hobby seriously and have been piecing ever since. After leaving the corporate world in 2009, I bought my first long arm quilting machine from A-I and then in 2017 upgraded to a Handi Quilter Fusion long arm with a pro sticher which I just love. My initial interest in long arming was just to quilt for myself, but then as the story goes, I started quilting for the public in 2011 doing edge to edge and playing with custom only for myself. I have won many awards on my quilts and have had two Paradise in Bloom and Vintage Rose at the International Quilt Show in Houston and Chicago with one of them, Vintage Rose, being displayed at the Texas Quilt Museum in La Grange, TX also. These Judy Niemeyer quilts were pieced by me and quilted by Valerie Wagner.

For the last 2 years I have been teaching the 2 fabric Bargello quilts featuring the Susie Weaver pattern of the same name all over Texas and having a ball meeting a lot of fun quilters!

The Workshop "Two Fab 2.0 Big Red Bargello Quilt" by Susie Weaver is a quilt that appears complicated BUT it's not! The pattern will be sold in my class as it is difficult to locate. You won't have a chance to read it beforehand, which is great, as it's very confusing. HOWEVER, I'll teach you all the fun secrets of this addictive quilt.

Volunteers have been hard at work already working on items for the quilt show boutique. It is a great time for anyone that would like to join in.








Block of the Month





June 2022 BOM
Tri County Quilt Guild
Double Diamond Block



Another easy block made of Half Square Triangles (HSTs). It's all in the arrangement!

NOTE: All seams are sewn with a scant 1/4' seam allowance.

Cut:

From Maroon—I strip 4" x WOF
From tan print—I strip 4" x WOF



Directions: Unfold the two fabrics and give them a press. Lay the maroon fabric on your cutting mat with the right side of the fabric facing up and lay the tan print fabric on top of the maroon fabric with the right side down. Make sure to line up the two fabrics exactly.

Cut the strips into 4" squares. Keep the pair of maroon and the tan print fabrics together.

Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of each tan square.

Sew each pair together with a scant 1/4" on each side of the diagonal line and cut on the drawn line.

Press the seam allowance to the dark fabric. You now have HST units.

Square each HST to 3-1/2" and trim the dog ears.

Using 16 of the HSTs, arrange the units as shown on the right.



Sew each row together pressing the seam allowance on each row in an alternating manner. (Row I to the left, row 2 to the right, etc.)

Then sew the rows together.



Give the block a good press and trim to 12-1/2". You're finished!

If you would, please return the plastic bag your block kit came in




MILES OF PILLOWCASES SMILES



Charity Bee & Community Service Bees



Our Charity Bee quilts are in desperate need of you. We have approximately 25 bins of quilt bundles (that is approximately 175 quilts) that need to be quilted.

If every member would take one bundle and quilt it, that would really help fulfill our need for quilts.

Now, for those of you that don't have a longarm, approximately, 20% of those 175 quilts (that is 35 quilts) can be quilted on a domestic sewing machine using a walking foot and decorative stitch. If you are a beginner quilter, one of those 35 quilts has your name on it. There is no expectation these numbers will ever change...so rest assured there will always be a bundle for you.

I have linked below some YouTube videos of quilting decorative stitches with a walking foot. Please take some time to view these videos, maybe practice on one or two squares of fabric and then dive in. These quilts are not "SHOW QUILTS". These quilts are given to recipients who don't care if the stitching design is perfect...just if the quilt will last their lifetime.

The two reasons I joined the guild are because I wanted to learn how to piece better and learn how to quilt my own quilt. With practice, I have learned both AND you can too.

Thanks for taking the time to read this. Every Wednesday, I will be parked in the Fairfield Baptist Church at 27240 US 290, Cypress, TX parking lot in front of the side door. To remind everyone, this is where the guild usually meets for meetings.


