From The President's Stash


Happy August,

August 2, 2022 Speaker — Dixie Frantz



Dixie Frantz is a recent widow, mother of three, grandmother to four little grandchildren and another due any day. She has quilted for 40 years, is a writer, traveler, and lover of life.

In 2018, after taking a collage class, she discovered collage quilting. Her first original pattern was a colorful collage panda named Moo-Shu. Her other collage quilt patterns include Trudi the Reindeer, and Bluebonnet, the Longhorn, a beginner Heart quilt, Texas flag, Origami "Peace Crane," several versions of a gumball machine, and an angel wings quilt (which will be released later in May). Her original pdf patterns can be found on her blog and sold on Etsy.

Just for fun and to feed her quilting habit, she works part-time at My Favorite Quilt Store (an online quilting warehouse located in Humble).

Dixie has taught collage art quilting classes at Cupcake Quilts and A Needle and Thread in the Houston area. She has presented trunk shows/workshops at Peace by Piecing Quilt Guild and Kingwood Quilt Guild.

Dixie has volunteered with a prayer quilt ministry at her church for over 10 years. The group makes about 80 prayer quilts per year for those sick in the parish.

Dixie supports MD Anderson's Ovarian Quilt Project with a donation quilt every two years in honor of her sister, Mary, who died of ovarian cancer. She also walks MD Anderson's Boot Walk, with family, in support of the hospital's mission to end cancer each fall.



She has volunteered for decades on behalf of the disabled community creating programs, social events, and awareness in the Kingwood area. Each year, she makes a quilt for The Village Learning Center's annual gala which raises funds for their day center. Her middle child/angel, Mimi, age 34 when she received her angel wings, was born with cerebral palsy and attended their day center until late 2018. Profits from Life's Loose Threads are donated to The Village Learning Center.

September Speaker & Workshop—Debby Walters



Like many quilters of my generation I began sewing by making doll clothes, then my own clothes and eventually my family's clothes. Over the years I have tackled custom ballroom dance costumes and both my daughters' wedding dresses. But I had no family that quilted so that was not in my purview. After my last child went to college I began quilting with Eleanor Burns on Saturday mornings. Now I have been quilting 30+ years and have loved every minute of it. I am also now a certified workshop junkie. I love to explore new ways to put fabric together to make a quilt. Just a few of those techniques include applique, paper piecing, quilting on old lin-

ens and most recently curved piecing.

Join me while I share 45+ quilts that demonstrate the techniques. Some are small and some large, a few simple and some complex, some winners, some not, but all made with enthusiasm as I went head first into a different way to use fabric, paint, thread, beads, and love of quilting.

The workshop will be the next day, September 7th from 10 to 4ish at Bobbins and Threads Quilt Shop, 10130 Grant Rd, Houston (249 and

Grant Rd). Debby is friends with Trish Lopes, Bobbins and Threads Shop owner and has requested that the class be there. She will teach you how to take the fear out of curved seams which is the first step in making Swirl blocks. You will explore using strip sets as a design element. Experiment with fabric placement, pattern and value to make secondary designs. You will have a choice of 2 different patterns to choose from. Brown Eyed Girl or Where Have All the Flowers Gone. Contact Char Peterson, Program Chair 206 909-1510 to sign up for the class, advise which pattern you choose, make arrangements for payment and once the payment is received, the supply list will be provided. The class fee is \$35. A template is necessary for this class (approximately \$30) and will be sold in class.

Block of the Month



August 2021 BOM Tri County Quilt Guild Strip Tube Block

You know the saying, "You make plans and God laughs?" That's my life right now. It's all good, but I'm having some unexpected surgery on my right hand and needed fast and easy blocks for August and September so I could create the blocks and get the directions typed up quickly before my hand is immobilized.

The August block is so quick and easy AND you should be able to make two blocks from the strip tube you'll create, so please make two if you can. Otherwise, return the leftover strip tube and I'll get them made up in September when my hand is healed.

Cream—I strip 2-3/4" by WOF Rose—I strip 2-3/4" by WOF Floral—I strip 5" by WOF



Directions:

Cut:

Sew the two 2-3/4" X WOF strips right sides together along one long side. Press to set the seam and then press toward the rose fabric. You should have a strip that's 5" X WOF. Lay the 5" floral strip on top of the two color strip right sides together and sew along BOTH long sides. You now have a strip tube!


You can use a Strip Tube Ruler, a speciality HST trimming ruler, or a square quilting ruler. I have used a 6-1/2" square ruler and the HST ruler.

On a specialty ruler, put the dashed 6-1/2" line on <u>one stitching line</u> on the floral fabric as shown. The pointed end of the ruler should be about at the other stitching line of the floral fabric. Make sure you're ruler is completely on the fabric and not on the selvage. Cut along both angled sides of the ruler. Do NOT cut along the stitched side.

Rotate your ruler and using the previous cut line, line up your ruler the same way and cut another triangle (upside down). There should be no wasted fabric from cut to cut.

You may want to rotate your fabric around for easier cutting or use a rotating mat. If you start close to the selvage, you should be able to cut 8 triangles which will be enough for two blocks.







Block of the Month



When using a 6-1/2" square ruler for this block, I put masking tape on the 45 degree line and I'm using the two sides marked with the extra 1/2". The masking tape is just to make it easier to see. The 45 degree line is placed on the stitching line of the floral fabric. You can always check YouTube for help with strip tubes.

You should have blocks where the pieced side shows two color patterns.

The cream fabric is in the middle on some blocks and there will be an equal number of blocks where the rose fabric is in the middle when you open up the strip tube pieces you've cut.

Set your long seam and press toward the floral fabric when the cream fabric is next to the floral. Press toward the rose fabric if it is next to the floral.





Arrange four blocks as shown.

Sew the top row together and press your seam to the left. Sew the bottom row together and press your seam to the right, Sew the two rows together and press the seam to row one.





Give the block a good press and trim to 12 1/2" square. You are finished!

You are now finished!


If you have anything you would love to donate, PLEASE give me a call and I'll come pick it up. Let's make this a great party.


- Flannel for the HUGS we donate.


