

# October Speaker & Workshop—Jan Mathews

Quilting began for me in 1999 and teaching in 2003. Focusing mainly on beginning quilters, I moved from hand piecing/quilting to machine piecing. I have been very fortunate to begin teaching beginners at International Quilt Festival in 2009. In 2012 I became a Certified Instructor for Judy Niemeyer Quilting. My teaching takes me from my home area of Stafford / Missouri City / Sugar Land, Texas to Bryan / College Station, Texas, Steamboat Springs, Colorado and Wyoming (city) and Traverse City, Michigan. Teaching became a full time endeavor in August, 2014, when I retired from "my day job." I am passionate about teaching and love helping students to "find their rhythm" (paper piecing).

During the span of my quilting career I have had the opportunity to learn from renowned instructors / designers including Jan Krentz, Judy Niemeyer, Joen Wolfrom, Gail Garber, Gloria Loughman, Judy Mathieson, Jacqueline de Jonge, and Helen Frost. Becoming a Certified Instructor for Judy Niemeyer Quilting in 2012 focused my teaching to mainly paper piecing "the Judy way," some traditional piecing techniques, and color theory.

In 2011 / 2012 quilt show season I was fortunate to have my Hawaiian Star (Judy and Bradley Niemeyer design) accepted into multiple international and national shows, including AQS shows in Knoxville and Grand Rapids, IQA's International Quilt Festival in Houston, NQA show in Columbus, Ohio, Northwest Quilting Expo in Portland, Oregon, the California State Fair (First in Class and Best of Division), and the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo (Judge's Choice, First in Class, and Best of Division).

In 2013 my "Borders Bonanza" quilt was recognized as Best of Show in the 3rd Annual Uptown Blanco Quilt Show (Texas Hill Country). Additionally, annual donation quilts have raised over \$25,000 for the five military service academies, local churches, and the Blanco County Library.

Jan Mathews Guild Class :

Other than the fact that the "Tree" batik fabric is directional, this is another easy quilt block! I was working on a block to use that I thought was easy, but it would take me 12 photos to make sure you saw what to do so we'll skip that block!

I'm calling this block the "CAN YOU HEAR ME NOW?" block because it's such strong colors that "LOUD" is another way to describe it. Let's close our 2022 Block of the Month Program with a Bang!

**NOTE: THE BATIK IS** "Trees" so they are ori-



A DIRECTIONAL FABRIC.!!! Please sew all ented in the same direction.

Cut: From the batik: 1—6 1/2" square 4—3 1/2" squares From the Chartreuse: 1—9" square From the dark plum: 1—7 1/2" square



ALL Seams sewn with a scant 1/4" seam allowance.

#### Directions:

Make 4 flying geese using Eleanor Burns directions from the video below. You only stitch four seams and then your ready to trim! It helps if you have a flying geese ruler, but it's not necessary. Or you can search YouTube for Quilt in a Day Flying Geese with Two Fabrics.

Trim the flying geese units to 3 1/2" tall by 6 1/2" wide.

Arrange the squares and flying geese units as shown on the right.



# **Block of the Month**

Stitch the top row together and press seam allowances to the outside. Stitch the middle row together and press seam allowances to the inside. Stich the bottom row together and press seam allowance to the outside.

Sew the rows together and press seam allowances to one side.



Give the block a good press and trim to 12 1/2" square.



# **Guild News**

#### FROM HelloCottons.com

#### Hello,

Our non-profit organization, Wrap Ukraine With Quilts, will be one of the featured charities at the Quilt Festival in Houston this year.

We would like all quilters in Texas to know that they can help Ukrainian refugees by bringing quilts to donate at our booth at the Festival.

#### About our organization:

In March of this year, Gina Halladay and Beth Hawkins (both pattern designers in the quilt industry) began an effort to send quilts of comfort and warmth to the refugees flooding the borders from Ukraine. Now 6 months later, 10,000 quilts have been donated from all 50 states and Canada! Over 9,000 of those quilts have already been shipped and/or delivered to refugee mothers and children in various refugee centers, orphanages, and other housing locations in Poland, Moldova, Romania, and into the safer parts of Ukraine.



Each donated quilt is inventoried, tagged, and tracked to its destination. The quiltmaker can choose to leave their name and hometown, and a message of comfort to the recipient. The recipient can then scan the code on the tag, and send a message in return to the quiltmaker, through our website (email addresses are kept private). We post photos daily on our social media, showing the process of getting the quilts into the hands of refugees. Often quiltmakers can spot their quilts wrapped around a child or family in the photos that are posted!

Can you let your guild members know that they have a unique opportunity to drop off donated quilts if they are attending the Quilt Festival in Houston this year? We would greatly appreciate it! The need for warmth, comfort, and love from overseas is great, and with winter coming, we would like to increase our shipments of quilts for Ukrainian refugees!

--Handmade quilts of any size are needed. They can be quilted or tied. Fleece, crocheted, infant swaddle flannels are accepted too.

--Quilts can be registered on our website at WrapUkraineWithQuilts.com if the quiltmaker would like to send a personal message and tag their quilt before dropping off. (We can also do that for them in our booth).

--Houston Quilt Festival, November 3-6, 2022 at the George Brown Convention center in downtown Houston.
