You will need to bring your sewing machine and your usual sewing supplies. If you have I" wide, sew-in type Velcro to donate to the project, please bring it with you. Assorted neutral thread colors should be fine.

Block of the Month



Let's kick off the Block of the Month for 2023 with a fun and easy block. Please see the tutorial from Cluck Cluck Sew for all of the details. We will use red fabric for the hearts, but if you would like to make each half with a different red fabric, that is fine. Please keep the background fabric all the same this time. You can use white, white on white, cream, white on cream or light tan.

You get a choice of sizes this time! You can make the 4", 6", 8" or 10" blocks. I have some layout ideas that will incorporate the variety that we will receive. This is also a great opportunity to experiment with different block sizes. Remember that the size of your blocks will actually be 4.5", 6.5", 8.5" or 10.5" including the seam allowances when the blocks are sewn together.

Make as many blocks as you would like to in any of the sizes listed. In the past, we would set half of the blocks aside for Charity Bee and do a drawing for the other half of the blocks as a block lottery. If we get enough blocks turned in, we can go back to that system. The blocks that are turned over to Charity Bee are made into quilts for the many organizations that our guild supports. I will have some block kits available at the January meeting if you would like to pick up one or more.

Since this block is in the January newsletter, it will be turned in in February. If you have any older blocks or unsewn block kits for Block of the Month, please bring them to the January meeting on Tuesday, January 3rd. Let's make 2023 a Happy, Scrappy New Year!
