










TCQG Displaying Quilts at Texas Oncology!

Educating the public on the current art of quilting is a part of our mission. Quilts are displayed at Texas Oncology facility in Sugar Land. It certainly brightens up the office and the clients and staff were so excited to see them!

This is the quilt that made me want to be a quilter.

The pattern is called "Two of Us" and was created by Pat Holly and Sue Nickels. It was the 2013 Block of the Month for "The Quilt Show" hosted by Alex Anderson and Ricky Tims

In the Fall of 2012, a friend asked me to go to The International Quilt Festival at the George R Brown Convention Center in Houston. I was not a quilter



and had no plans to become a quilter, but I went to spend time with my friend. I was amazed at the the beautiful quilts on display, but still wasn't interested. Then I passed by a booth that had this quilt on display and I knew I had to learn to quilt! I had sewn clothing since was about I4, so I knew how to sew. What really impressed me about this quilt was the many triangles, curved pieces and the color choices. Oh my, the color choices! I had no clue you could put colors together like this quilt had. I made a couple of simple lap quilts while I waited for the fabric kit to arrive and then spent two years making this quilt.

This quilt has Foundation Paper Piecing, Sewing Curves and Raw Edge Applique that I finished by stitching a blanket stitch around each flower, leaf and stem. There was a big learning curve in making this quilt since i was fairly new to these quilting techniques. I finished piecing the top and took it to be quilted. We moved before the long arm quilter could get to it, so I took it back home, completed the move, and the quilt sat in a closet for 5 years. In 2020 while on Facebook, I saw some extraordinary quilting someone had done and researched who had done the work. It was Louise Klare of K 7 Quilting, so I took the quilt to her. It turned out she lives 2 miles away from me.

In 2022, I had the chance to visit The National Quilt Museum in Paducah, KY. and the original "Two of Us" quilt happened to be on display at that time.

Tips and Techniques May 2023

Sewing Machine Needle Selection & Use Submitted by Marie Engelhart

Topstitch needles are very good all-round needles to use for piecing as well as topstitching. They have a light sharp point, an elongated eye and have a deep groove lining the shaft of the needle. The topstitch needle is the same needle as the metallic needle. Dr. Bob of Superior Threads states that you choose the correct needle size based on the thread you're using, not on your fabric.

- 70/10—fine weight threads such as kimono silk, MonoPoly, and 60 weight threads.
- 80/12—piecing weight threads such as Masterpiece, So Fine! #50 and 50 weight threads
- 90/14—Quilting/Embroidery threads, King Tut, Rainbows, Highlights, 40 weight threads
- 100/16—heavy threads such as So Fine! 30, Sew Sassy, 30 weight threads Marie states she uses a Microtex needle when sewing batiks as the batik fabric is so densely woven. The Microtex needle has a very slim, acute tip.

There are two types of needles. Regular and titanium coated. A regular needle should be replaced after 4-8 hours of use. Titanium coated needles can be used for about 60 hours before needing to be replaced which makes titanium needles more cost effective to use since they only cost about 20 cents more per needle.

This information comes from the CD: <u>Thread Therapy with Dr. Bob—Eliminate Your Frustrations with Thread, Needles and Tension</u>. The CD was produced by Superior Threads.
