
# August Speaker is Tiffany Hayes

# **2024 QUILT SHOW NEWS**





# **2024 QUILT SHOW NEWS**



#### Making a Quilt Show Ribbon

Guild members **Deb Durr** and **Vicki Tate** serve as co-chairs of the Ribbon Committee for our upcoming Quilt Show. This is Deb's second time chairing the Ribbon Committee and Vicki's first time. They were recently asked to brief our members on the process of how our ribbons come together. Read on to hear what they had to say about the ribbon-making process.

#### From Deb and Vicki:

Our process began as soon as we learned the theme of the Quilt Show. It was a no-brainer to decide to make the ribbons look like flowers. We got our heads together and made a few prototypes and decided on a final design.

As with all aspects of the Show, it takes a village to make the ribbons. Part of our village are the wonderful ladies of Quilty Pleasures Bee who have been working hard to make all the petals. Each ribbon has

16 petals, and it is quite a task to get all those cut and sewn. Another big part of our village are the ladies of Quilter's Dozen Bee who made all the tails. As each ribbon has two tails, that was also quite a task. Our thanks to both of those Bees for all their hard work.





We also went to several individuals for other ribbon-making tasks. Thanks to Connie Suarez for cutting the matboard circles, and to Rhonda Van Alstine, Shari Stone, Shelly Wiggins and Theresa Wavra who embroidered the Show Logo for the center medallions.

We will be seeking more volunteers when we begin constructing the ribbons. Construction of the ribbons will commence as soon as all the components are ready.

A few interesting facts:

- We purchased over 60 yards of fabric to make the component parts.
- We used 12 large matboards for the backing of the ribbons.
- Based on the categories, we are making uch as Best of Show, Judges Choice, and morely

about 225 ribbons plus the special ribbons such as Best of Show, Judges Choice, and more!

It is so much fun to be involved in something so creative, and we hope all winners will be proud to display our ribbons.

Guild members are encouraged to enter up to three quilts in the upcoming Show. Who knows? You may win a beautiful ribbon in 2024!

However, we WILL have our monthly Boutique workshop on the third Tuesday in July. The workshop will be held at Bobbins & Threads, located at 10130 Grant Road. The third Tuesday in

July is the 18th, and we start at 10:00 a.m.

For the July project, we will be making reusable, washable bags to take to the store for your groceries. The workshop will be led by June Jaronitzky. You will need your usual machine sewing supplies along with your sewing machines. It looks like a fun and very easy project.

## **Block of the Month**



#### July 2023 BOM Colorwash Units

These units can be me made with precise measurements or improv style. They are simple units and will be a colorful and versatile addition to our Charity Bee quilts. They should measure 6 I/2" when you turn them in. They will finish at 6" once they are in a quilt.

NOTE: All seams are sewn with a scant 1/4" seam allowance. For this block, please press seams out as you are making the blocks—press away from the center.

Fabric needed for each unit:

Center square — one 2 1/2" x 2 1/2"

Border fabric — two 2 1/2" x 2 1/2" and two 2 1/2" x 6 1/2"

There are no specific color requirements for these blocks. Please select contrasting fabrics for each unit, since there are only two fabrics being used.

#### **Directions:**

First you will sew a 2 1/2" border square to one side of the center square and press away from the center. Then you will sew the other 2 1/2" border square to the opposite side of the center square and press away from the center. You should have a piece that measures 2 1/2" x 6 1/2".

Next you will sew one 2 1/2" x 6 1/2" border strip to one side of the unit that you just created. Press away from the center unit. Repeat, adding the remaining border strip to the other side of the center unit and press away from the center.

You should have a unit that measures 6 1/2" square.

You may make additional units from your stash using a center fabric and border fabric of your choice. We are trying to assemble both bright and masculine theme quilts, so the units will be divided into kits for Charity Bee with other blocks that coordinate nicely.

How about some improv units? You may use your scraps to make this same type of unit but with any measurements necessary to yield a unit that ends up measuring 6 1/2" square. You can start with a smaller (or larger) square for the center, or even a rectangle. Then add the desired border fabric to the sides and then the border fabric to the top and bottom, just as before. You can sew according to what scraps you have available and then trim your unit to 6 1/2".

These units are inspired by Terry Rowland of TRow Studios. She did a scrap challenge in 2022 with this type unit in a smaller size. You can watch her videos on YouTube and see her pictures on @trowstudios on Instagram. I will share links on the Tri-County Quilt Guild Group page on Facebook.

Please sew these blocks in the months of June and July and turn in at the August 2023 guild meeting. Please remember that there is not a guild meeting in July due to the holiday.
