

Secretary

Primary duties:

Provide minutes of each monthly Guild and Board meeting to the Executive Board and Standing Chairs and shall maintain a file of these minutes

Provide minutes of each monthly Guild meeting to the Web Administrator for posting on the Guild's website

Maintain the Guild's ballots for a period of one year after each annual election

Participate in the Revision Committee on Bylaws, Guild Policies, Duties of Elected Officers, and Responsibilities of Standing Chairs on an as-needed basis

Program Chair



September Boutique Workshop

The September Boutique workshop will be held on the third Tuesday of the month, September 19th. It will be held at Bobbins & Threads Quilting & Crafts located at 10130 Grant Road, Houston, Texas 77070. We start at 10:00 and finish about 3:00.

Our project for September will be the large Show and Tell bags. A number of our members kindly took bundles of fabric and batting to quilt for us as this project requires a yard and a half of quilted fabric. It is a large project!

Since we are dealing with quilted fabric, you might want a walking foot or even feed foot. We will zigzag some raw edges inside the bag and apply bias binding along the top edge before turning it over and stitching it down. You will need your usual sewing supplies.

If you are one of the kind quilters who took bundles to quilt for us, please return them no later than the September guild

meeting on September 5th. We have received most of the quilt bundles at this point, but a few are still out there. We need to do some prep before the workshop.





All of us on the Boutique Committee wish to thank those who quilted the fabrics for us. Thank you very much for all your time and effort. You are making this project possible.

If you are new to our guild, you might want to know what the Boutique is. The Boutique Committee is responsible for leading workshops where we make gift items to sell at the Boutique Gift Shop booth during our guild quilt shows. The committee members try to select projects which we think can be completed in a single workshop.

Workshops are held on the third Tuesday of the month and all members are welcome. We also accept donations of projects from our very generous bees and individual members. If the workshop date is open on your busy calendar, sign up and join us. You might learn something new or have fun meeting other members.

We have one last item:

If any of our members have finished or unfinished projects at home from prior Boutique workshops, please find them and bring them back as soon as possible. Even if you have not had time to complete them, please return them to us so they can be accounted for, completed, and tagged. Thank you for helping us.

September 2023 BOM Star Block—Quilter's Choice

Due to time constraints this month, we are doing something a bit different. We will be making star blocks, but you get to choose the design. Our color scheme will be open for two different options—blue and white or blue and tan. We are trying to collect blocks that will be suitable for making charity bee quilts for men, so please keep that in mind when selecting your fabrics. The only other request for this month is that you make blocks that will finish at 12". You may select any star pattern from sources that you may have at home and I'll share an online source below. You may choose to do traditional piecing or paper piecing, whichever you prefer. Give the block a good press and trim to 12 1/2" square.

One great source for online patterns is The Quilter's Cache. See details below for navigation tips.

You will see alphabetized list options on the left side of the page and blocks
by size on the right side of the page.

I will be distributing block patterns and kits at the September guild meeting for anyone that is interested. Sew your star blocks during the month of September and turn them in at the October guild meeting.

Tips and Techniques

Cleaning Your Design Wall

Last month I wrote about different types of design walls. But, what do you do when your flannel design wall is covered with bits of thread? I found my blocks don't stick very well on my flannel design wall when it gets dirty. (I'm showing a flannel covered design board as the example.)

At the International Quilt Festival, I bought a special scrubber that slips over my four finger tips. I think it was \$5. One side has soft foam with the company name. The side you use has a "scrubby" texture. It's supposed to be different than a regular kitchen scrubber pad, but is it?



Inquiring minds wanted to know, so I bought several different types of scrubber pads at the grocery store and tried them out. The short answer to the question is —- The design wall scrubber I bought at the IQF does work and the regular kitchen scrubbers don't work at all or not very well.

Then I read about silicone kitchen scrubbers that will clean your design wall. I didn't find the one that I saw in the article. It looked like it might be a little thicker than what I did buy and it had a place to slip a finger through to help hold it on your hand. I'll keep looking for that one, but I did buy a package of six silicone scrubbers on Amazon for \$6.



How do they work? —- Great! The \$1 silicone scrubber works as well as the \$5 purchased one! And since I have 6, maybe I'll be able to find one when I need one!

(Here's the purchased scrubber, a clean silicone scrubber and one I used.)

The purchased design wall scrubber doesn't have a problem releasing thread bits, but the silicone scrubber does; so I wrapped blue painter's tape around my hand and dabbed at the scrubber to get the thread bits off. I hope I'v given you an idea that will help you clean your design wall.




Hi Tri County Quilt Guild,
