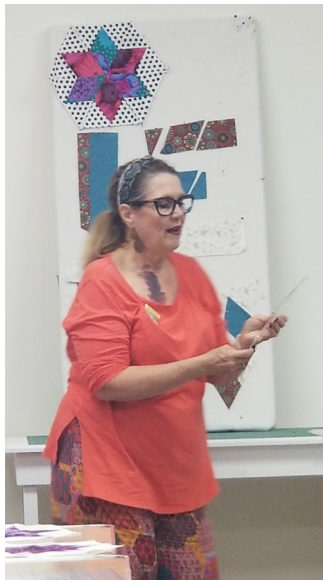

JUDGES AT OUR QUILT SHOW and other useful information...

Who will be judging my quilt? What will they be looking for when they judge? How will I know what they think of my quilt?

Have you been asking yourself these questions? If so, we'd like to introduce you to the four judges for our 2024 Quilts in Bloom show.

CINDY ERICKSON **2024 TCQG QUILT SHOW JUDGE**

Cindy started her career as an interior designer in Arizona and Utah, then specialized in creating applique wall hangings and clothing for boutiques.

Since being introduced to the rotary cutter and half-square triangle, she's been unstoppable. Cindy makes commission quilts and samples for various international companies and individuals (including RJR and P&B). She is an NQA certified Quilt Judge and teaches quilting and clothing specialty classes at Bernina Sewing Center in Omaha as well as lecturing and teaching classes around the country. She is qualified to judge Master Quilts, Modern and art quilts of all techniques.

She specializes in teaching rotary and sewing machine skills in all aspects of quilt making to all skill levels. "Professional Quilter Magazine" nominated her for National Teacher of the Year in 2009.

She has been published in Quiltmaker, Fons and Porters magazine and Leisure Arts publications. Cindy designed some books and patterns with Jo Morton.

One of the patterns was on the cover of Keepsake Quilting catalog. Cindy's quilts have been shown in AQS, Houston, PIQS and NQA. (www.cindyerickson.com)



SHERRY MASSEY **2024 TCQG QUILT SHOW JUDGE**

Sherry began quilting in 1980. Countless quilts later, she is honored to be Oklahoma's first NACQJ Certified Judge. She is a member of the Edmond Quilt Guild and has served as the Edmond Quilt Show chairman and most recently as judging room coordinator, a job that is both educational and rewarding.

She has had two quilts juried into AQS shows in Paducah for fall 2017 and spring 2019. She is a proud member of a small group that makes quilts for Boys' Ranch Town.

She teaches English Paper Piecing classes and enjoys helping guilds discover the rewards of holding judged shows. Sherry is the Senior Registrar for the Oklahoma History Center where a collection of over 400 quilts is housed.

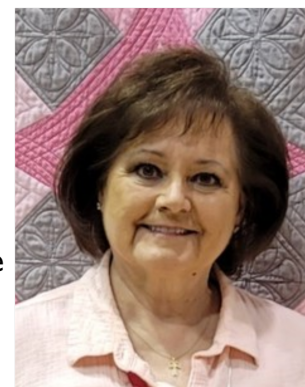
After twice visiting Japan, she has developed a deep admiration for traditional Japanese textiles and is currently working on a project that incorporates vintage indigo cottons and kimono silks with vintage American cottons and linens.





JACKIE RUFFING **2024 TCQG QUILT SHOW JUDGE**

Jackie has had a love for quilting since she was given her first quilt in 1972 made by her great-grandmother. She grew up sewing under the watchful eye of her mother, who in her own right, was a talented seamstress. After a few years of making her own clothes, Jackie turned her focus to quilt making. She studied the process of drafting block designs and quilting templates, to hand quilting then to machine quilting. An opportunity came, and she purchased a long-arm quilting machine.



Jackie started a quilting business, winning several awards for her customers and herself. Her work has been shared nationally and internationally. After 21 successful years, she decided to move into another quilting field as a quilt show judge.

Quilting is not only a love; it is a passion for her. Jackie is a member of several societies and guilds supporting the ideals of the quilting craft. She is a guest speaker at guilds presenting a program about antique quilts and what makes a winning quilt.

Jackie's judging and quilt show experience includes county fairs, guild shows, and partner shows with the National Association of Certified Quilt Judge (NACQJ). As a candidate in the certification program with NACQJ, Jackie feels she is coming full circle in the quilting world.

SHAWN SICKLE **2024 TCQG QUILT SHOW JUDGE**

Quilting was something that Shawn Sickle admired from a far while she was busy raising a family and running a business. Her mother was an avid quilter, and they would regularly go to quilt shows over the years. Then in 2010, the opportunity came to make a quilt for her first granddaughter, and the rest is history, as they say.

That first quilt sparked an interest that has since blossomed into a passion. In 2018, she was introduced to longarm quilting which expanded her repertoire and catapulted the progression into quilt judging.

Since becoming a candidate of the National Association of Certified Quilt Judges (NACQJ) in 2022, Shawn is actively judging and working in shows throughout the country. In 2023 she was a finalist in the Cherrywood Fabric Challenge and the Hoffman Fabric Challenge, as well as being juried into a Studio Art Quilt Associates (SAQA) show. Shawn is driven to pursue a judging certification through the NACQJ to share her passion for the craft as well as to empower and encourage fellow quiltmakers.





Following are some **FAQs** on quilt judging:

What will the judge be looking for? One of our judges, Shawn Sickle, will be our February general meeting speaker. She will be answering these types of questions as well as others. We are beyond excited to have her speak just before our show!

How do I know what the judge thinks of my quilt? The judging form will be included with your quilt when you pick it up at the end of the show on Saturday. It shows the items the judges looked at and all comments made.

How should I respond to the information received?

Celebrate! You have entered your quilt in a show and received valuable feedback from skilled quilt judges. Carefully review the comments and other information shared. Use the information to fine tune your quilting skills.

Quilt Appraisals Available at the Show

Quilt appraiser Marcia Kaylakie will be on site at the show to appraise quilts. The fee will be \$65.00 per quilt, and reservations are required.

Emails will be sent to guild members with a link for making reservations. You are encouraged to sign up early as there are a limited number of slots available on each day. Quilts hanging in the show can be appraised while hanging.

Don't miss this opportunity to have a treasured quilt appraised!

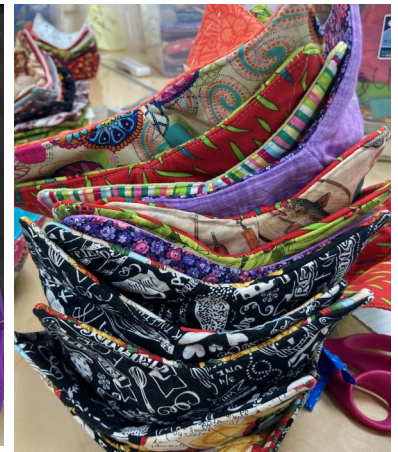

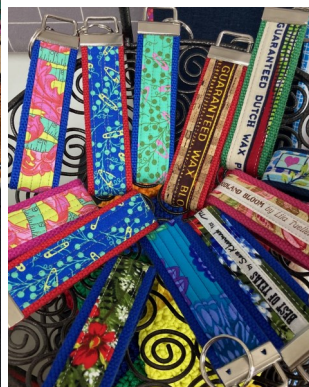




The Gift Boutique is Blooming!

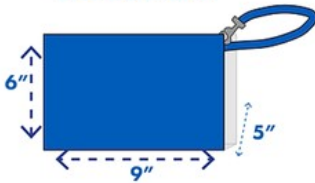

Important

Change is good, but it can also create a challenge.

As you are finishing up your entry quilt(s), please contact Janice Toler immediately if any of the following changes have occurred:

- the size of your quilt has shifted (even if by an inch)
- you will not finish your quilt in time for the show
- you have changed your quilt name or inspiration

These seem like small details, but such changes have a HUGE impact on the volunteers assigned to create the plan for the quilt display area, hang quilts, and ensure each quilt is showcased with accurate information.

Some of these tasks must be completed weeks before the show; your diligence assists these teams in carrying them out with ease. Just imagine a quilt that won't fit into the space reserved for it causing a chain reaction of reorganizing that devours time and drains energy!

We are counting on you to help us with these important items. Please take action immediately if you have one or more of the changes noted above.

Tips & Techniques February 2024

I saw a bumper sticker that I should put on my car. It said, “I sew like I drive. Fast and barefoot!” Is that ever true for me! (At least the sewing part now. I used to drive barefoot, though.)

Do you sew fast? I do especially when chain piecing and recently my chain piecing had some totally unacceptable spots.



So I did what I knew I was supposed to do:

Slow down my sewing.

Use both hands.

Pay attention to what I'm supposed to be doing.

I'm not sure why I think sewing is supposed to be a race, but I have to make myself slow down quite often. I've found that by keeping both hands on my fabric, I usually do a much better job of feeding the fabric under the needle. There's probably a physics law about equal pressure somewhere out there. And I need to quilt watching a movie while I sew. I love to sew! I should enjoy it for the sheer pleasure it gives me. I really slow my body's temp down when I sew in a quiet Room.

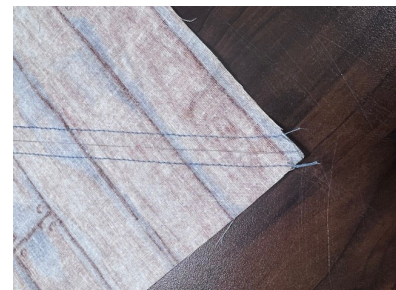
As I write this article, I get confused. I can't tell if I'm talking about sewing or driving! Maybe I'll work on my driving, too!

Anyway, after applying the three things I know make my seams better, here is how my chain piecing looked. Much nicer seams and I'm sure my HSTs will look better, too!

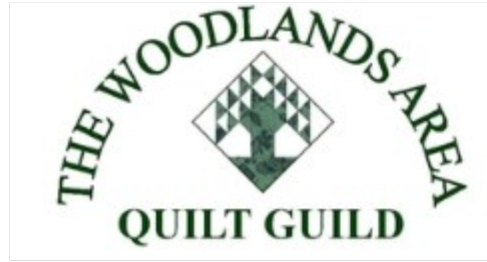

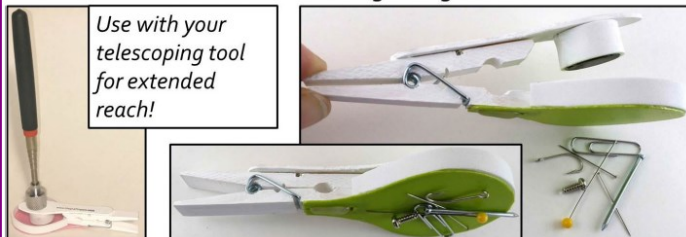
