TREASURER AISLE

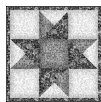
Enjoy our "treasures at a discount" items for quilting, arts & crafts.

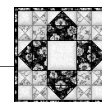
NO FOOD OR DRINK in the exhibit hall. The Berry Center does not allow outside food in the facility. There is a food court in the atrium for your convenience.

QUILT SHOW JUDGES



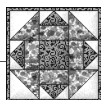
