# **Speakers and Workshops and Fun Stuff!**



May 7, 2024 Lecture - Ann Moore

"Ann Moore Quilting" out of Huntsville, Tx, will give her lecture on her quilting journey with her quilts from the time she began to present.

Ann, a free motion quilting instructor, fell in love with the Westalee Rulers when she discovered them at the Houston International Festival. Teaching quilting with rulers was a natural progression, and students find that ruler work is much easier and rewarding. She incorporates ruler work and free motion quilting into her quilts and classes, if requested. At the Houston Festival in 2023, her Artisan Garden received a Livestock Show and Rodeo Blue Ribbon award. This quilt was originally designed as a teaching tool using the quilt-as—you-go method, and she knew the quilt needed more. She added corded binding and bicone crystal beads of various sizes to embellish the quilt.

# Tips & Techniques Best Practices in Fabric Storage May 2024

These tips come from Suzy Quilts.

- 1. **Prevent Light Damage**. This is the most serious threat to your fabric. It's OK to store your fabric on a shelf, but be sure to minimize the amount of light in your sewing room. Close the blinds/curtains as much a possible and turn the lights off when you're not sewing.
- 2. **Monitor Temperature and Humidity.** If you sew in a room where you're comfortable, then you shouldn't have to worry too much about temperature and humidity. If your workspace is an uninsulated attic or basement, take extra precautions to prevent mold and mildew. You may want a good dehumidifier for your basement to keep mold and mildew at bay. Attics can be hot and dry, which will cause your fabric to become brittle.
- 3. Use Safe Storage Materials. It's an old wives tale that a cedar chest is good for keeping moths and other fabric-eating insects away. According to a textile preservationist, cedar chests are capable of doing damage to your fabric and they don't keep moths away. If you want to store your fabric in an old dresser or cabinet, coat any wood that will touch your fabric with two layers of polyurethane varnish and wrap your fabric in unbuffered acid-free tissue. Even with these two tips, there's still a risk. Your best bet is to sore fabric in a polypropylene tub. And it does need to be polypropylene. On the bottom of the tub there will be a "5" in the center of the recycling symbol and the letters "PP" underneath.
- 4. **Quilting fabric is made to be used!** If you're concerned about best practices for fabric storage, then use your fabric! Cut it up and make quilts for you and your loved ones to enjoy. These tips are great for preservation of special fabric, but use your fabric to make lovely quilts!

How do you store your fabric? I'm very lucky that I have a closet that was designed to keep school books so I have plenty of shelves that are protected from light. Yardage is folded and stacked by color and fat quarters are folded and stacked in clear containers.

I just looked and found out that my containers are NOT polypropylene so I'd better close this "Tips & Techniques" article and go pull some fabric to make another quilt!




