# 2026 Quilt Show Rules for Entering Quilts

We have had some questions about entering quilts. Although all the rules will not be addressed here, we will attempt to state and clarify some of the rules as we get questions. Please feel free to ask the Quilt Show Chairs questions if you have them.

**Is there a timeframe for completing an eligible quilt?** The answer is yes. The quilt or related entry must have been completed AFTER February 27, 2024 except category "display only quilts". This means that if you take the last stitch AFTER February 27, 2024, you are good. In interpreting "the last stitch" it does not include embellishing, modifying, adding a sleeve, or adding additional quilting to a quilt completed prior to February 27, 2024.

**Can a member enter a quilt for a non-member?** The answer is no. Rules state that "Entrant must be a member in good standing (dues paid) of TCQG by October 31, 2025.

# Tips & Techniques

# Tips & Techniques November 2024

This is a quick tip and maybe more of a referral, but I thought I'd send it anyways.

I'm guessing that most of us have a favorite marking tool, but in case you don't, I'd like to recommend a few things that I use.

The Leonis water soluble pen: It has blue ink, so it's good for light fabrics and usually comes off with a light spritz of water. I'll admit that sometimes if it's been on the fabric for a while, a gentle rub on the wet area will finish the job. I've never had a problem removing the mark or its coming back.

The Cahko chalk marker: I have white chalk in mine, but it does come in several other colors, and the chalk is refillable. I use this on dark fabrics, and it does come off easily. (Almost too easily, so be careful handling your marked fabric.)

A sliver of soap: Ever wonder what to do with the bar of soap when it's too small to use in the shower? Put it in your sewing room and mark your dark fabrics with it. It seems I can always find my soap. I can't say the same thing for my Chako pen.

Now, what if you have a favorite marking pen and you don't want to change? That's ok with me, but I do want to say that if you have a little trouble getting your marks off your fabric, I've read that a teaspoon of baking soda in a small spritz bottle filled with water is supposed to help the marks come off. I haven't had a chance to try this, though. So give it a try if you need help removing your marks.






