January Block of the Month

Happy January! I'm Rebecca, and I'll be taking over the Block of the Month for 2025 now that Lisa Hart has stepped down.

With January and goal setting, many of us say this will be the year we clean out our scraps! I've got a fun block that will help with that to get the year started. I'm not much of a scrappy quilter, so these blocks stretch my scrap muscles a lot!

String blocks are an easy way to use up some of those longer scraps we have (and even those layer cake squares that you don't really love).

They look good using any fabrics, but look best when you stick to a color scheme (2 or 3 colors), and keep sizes consistent. If you've never made them before, this will be a fun exercise to try!

What you'll need:

I- 10"x10" square of light fabric (or a non-favorite fabric that is light colored when turned over)

Approximately 15-20 strips of fabric 1"-2" thick, ranging from 3"-15" in length





Before you begin:


If your scraps are not thin enough, take some time to cut scraps into strips so you'll have plenty to choose from for this block.




January Block of the Month

Find the longest strip of fabric and lay it on the diagonal, **RIGHT SIDE UP** on the square. (Using a glue stick to hold it in place can be helpful here) Lay another **RST** and stitch along that seam using a 1/4" seam, press open.

Repeat on the opposite side of the original strip.





Continue adding strips outward toward each corner until the entire 10" square is covered. The original 10" square may be slightly skewed.

Flip the square over and trim the block to 9.5"x9.5", making sure all sides are within the 10" square.





And you're done! Stitch up a few of these and bring them to the February meeting!

- A Panel to Thread Paint....Large Florals are fun and easy to get started on.
- Good quality threads in various colors and thread weight. Aurifil is my thread of choice.
- Medium weight stabilizer which will stay on your piece, so no wash away.
- Sewing machine that you can drop the feed dogs on. If you have a machine with a Stitch Regulator that's perfect, but not required as long as your feed dogs can be dropped. A New Needle in your machine.
- 50wt 12wt to start with.
- And Your Creative Juices and Imagination!!!

2026 Quilt Show Rules for Entering Quilts

We have had some questions about entering quilts. Although all the rules will not be addressed here, we will attempt to state and clarify some of the rules as we get questions. Please feel free to ask the Quilt Show Chairs questions if you have them.

Is there a timeframe for completing an eligible quilt? The answer is yes. The quilt or related entry must have been completed AFTER February 27, 2024 except category "display only quilts." This means that if you take the last stitch AFTER February 27, 2024, you are good. In interpreting "the last stitch" it does not include embellishing, modifying, adding a sleeve, or adding additional quilting to a quilt completed prior to February 27, 2024.

Can a member enter a quilt for a non-member? The answer is no. Rules state that "Entrant must be a member in good standing (dues paid) of TCQG by October 31, 2025.



Does your foot pedal scoot all over the floor? Mine did until I saw this trick. I have a 5 pound dumbbell weight that was mainly getting used as a way to hold my long ruler still while cutting with a rotary cutter. I now use the weight to hold my foot pedal in place while sewing. No more chasing that foot pedal around that wood floor!

I've enjoyed writing these columns. I hope you've enjoyed reading them and have found a few tips or techniques that make your sewing time more pleasant.











