FOR ALL OF US:

Spot a Phishing Email/Text/Phone Scam:

Generic Greetings: "Dear user"
Attachments: DON'T Open them
Urgent Response Needed: Don't heed these
Warnings of Compromised Account: See above.

Includes URL: "Danger Will Robinson" if it looks odd or has odd characters
Asks for Sensitive Info: Don't provide personal, credit card, account information
Poorly Written: Typos, misspellings and grammar issues are common If it comes from a long
lost African prince: run, don't walk, away.

FORTHE KIDS:

There exist "Job Hunt Scams" that try to take advantage of those seeking gainful employment. Job scams include phishing, fake job websites, and data entry scams. They often involve requests for personal information or money.

Job scam red flags:

Requests for money: Scammers may ask for application fees, training payments, or other upfront costs.

Requests for personal information: Scammers may ask for bank account information or other sensitive details.

Unverifiable company information: Scammers may not provide a physical office location or verifiable contact information.

Job listings with suspicious details: Job listings may have vague descriptions, unrealistic compensation, or bogus company websites.

High-pressure hiring: Scammers may seem overly eager to hire or may offer flexible hours. Unclear interview process: Scammers may not offer phone calls or video interviews, or the interview process may seem too easy.

How to avoid job scams:

Be wary of job postings that ask for money or personal information upfront.

Research the company online for reviews and warnings.

Report scams to the Better Business Bureau and the job platform where you found the posting.

March Block of the Month



March's Block is adapted from a free pattern by Shannon Fabrics called Menagerie. This is a simple block made from rectangles.

There will be 12 kits available at the meeting on March 4th if you'd like to contribute to the charity quilt.

Any additional blocks made with your own fabric brought to the March meeting will be included in the bundle for the raffle winner at the meeting. If you would like to make some blocks from your stash, please use three shades of the same color along with a solid or tone-on-tone white for the background color.

Stitch these up and bring them to the March meeting on **Tuesday, April 1st**. Looking forward to seeing a beautiful rainbow of your donated blocks!

March Block of the Month


Choose a white background (or fabric that reads white) and one color that you have a light, medium, and dark shade of. It does not matter which shade you consider Fabric 1, 2, or 3.

What you'll need:

I - 7" square Fabric II - 5"x7" Fabric 2I - 5"x13" Fabric 3

I - 2"x7" Background


I - 2"x13" Background



Steps:

- Using a 1/4" seam allowance, sew the top row together following the picture (below left).
- Attach the 13" pieces together with the background strip on top.
- When attaching the top and bottom units, make sure the 7" square is on the **top left** side.
- Your block should measure 13"x13".

NEEDED SUPPLIES FOR UPCOMING BOUTIQUE PROJECTS:

Colorful floral fabrics. They can be scraps if there are full flowers that we can fussy cut.

Cotton doilies

Midweight fusible interfacing: at least 21 inches in length.

Batting to continue our quilting for the Show and Tell Bags. SIZE NEEDED 48 X 60.

3/4" by 8' wooden dowel rods for our Show and Tell Bags. Sara Irwin will cut and finish the dowel rods for us. Thank You, Sara!

Libby will be in the Lobby at our next Guild meeting to receive any donations.

Striped Binding

Don't you just love a striped binding? I know I do! Getting the stripes to match is an easy thing to do, too.

Lay your binding strips right sides together at a 90 degree angle as usual.

Fold the top fabric back at a 45 degree angle. You can use the edge of a stripe to help with this.

(Here I've shown the fold line from folding the top fabric back at a 45 degree angle.)



Slide the top fabric to the left or right so the stripes line up perfectly. (Make sure you still have a 1/4" seam allowance to the right of the fold line on the bottom fabric.)

I take a glue stick and put a few dabs on the fabric where the seam allowances will be.



Open the top fabric back up and either give it a quick press or pin it for a couple of minutes to let the glue dry.

Stitch along the fold line. Open the binding strip up and check to make sure you have your stripes matched the way you want and then trim your seam allowance.



Press your seam allowance open and fold your binding in half. Press and admire your perfectly matched stripes!


