- Credit Card Scams: "Bank" calls and offers to come and pick up your "compromised" credit card. This is NOT a bank calling. Do not give anyone your credit card.
- Rental Property Scams: No property exists or is already booked. Don't give money upfront for a rental. If deal seems too good to be true, it probably is!
- Fake Web Sites: These do exist. Use caution on strange web sites.
- Phone Call Scams: Don't accept a random call as someone who's telling you the truth. Verify legitimacy through another means (not one supplied by the caller).
- Other Warning Signs of a Scam: Pressure to act now; Upfront fees and wonderful returns from your fees; Don't by gift cards as a form of payment.



REMINDER: The **March block** was the **Menagerie** made with the kit or three tones of one color.


I will be collecting these at the meeting on **April 1st**. For every 2 blocks that you turn in, you will receive a raffle ticket.

April Block of the Month

April's Block is called the Brasstown Star quilt block.

There will be kits available at the meeting on April 1st if you'd like to contribute to the charity quilt.



If you would like to make some blocks from your stash to donate to a quilt top for Charity Bee, please use green, blue, and yellow fabrics in any arrangement. Stitch these up and bring them to the May meeting on **Tuesday**, **May 6th**.

April Block of the Month

What you'll need:

Fabric 1:

- 4 4 1/2" squares
- 4 4" squares. Cut along diagonal to create a total of 8 triangles

Fabric 2:

- I 4 1/2" square
- 4 4" squares. Cut along diagonal to create a total of 8 triangles

Fabric 3:

4 - 3 %" squares

steps I and 2.



Steps:


- **I.** Fold each triangle in half along the long edge and finger press a small crease in the center.
- **2.** Along each side of the Fabric 3 squares, fold in half and finger press a small crease in the center.
- 3. Following the diagram, create 4 units using the Fabric 3 squares and Fabric 1 and 2 triangles. Note: to ensure your triangles are centered, line up the creases you made in
- **4.** Trim these blocks to $4\frac{1}{2}$, making sure to leave $\frac{1}{4}$ around each point of the diamond.





Make

5. Assemble the block in a nine-patch following the diagram.

This workshop introduces quilters to the Basic Set cutting templates and the Drunkard's Path block with its many (MANY!) variations.




