Look out for "*ishing" attacks.

* can be Phishing, Smishing, Vishing
(and I'm sure there are more!!!)

The latest form of ishing seems to be "Vishing" where this is Voice Phishing. All is being used to impersonate the sound, intonation, vocabulary, accent of friends, family, senior U.S. officials, Official Government Offices. The advice from the FBI is "Do NOT assume messages from government officials are authentic without independent verification."

Smishing makes use of smartphone text and messaging capabilities to state "You owe/used/received goods/services for which you owe money." They are pretending to be toll road authorities, delivery companies, or government agencies. Basically any one you might have a legitimate interaction where money is involved.


Phishing is the old email from an African Prince and any other form of email scam.

BEST ADVICE: Delete these messages if obviously a fake.

NEXT BEST ADVICE: Verify through an INDEPENDENT method, NOT one included in the message. Don't be lazy here. The scammers are counting on the convenience of a supplied URL link, email address, or phone number to suck you in. All of these supplied reply methods lead back to the scammer. NOTE: Carefully check the spelling of the entity in the email. Small spelling "errors" can lead to the wrong company or person.



REMINDER: The **May block** was the **Anvil** made with the kit or earth tones.





June Block of the Month

June's Block is called the Disappearing 9 Patch Block. It is a very common block that is super simple if you can sew a 9-patch and 4-patch!





Any additional blocks made with your own fabric brought to the <u>August</u> meeting will be included in additional charity bee quilts. If you would like to make some blocks from your stash, use any colors you'd like - let's make this one super scrappy!

Stitch these up and bring them to the <u>August</u> meeting on **Tuesday**, **August 5th**. Looking forward to seeing a beautiful assortment of your donated blocks!

June Block of the Month

What you'll need:

Accent Fabric Fabric 1 Fabric 2

(1) $4\frac{3}{4}$ " squares (2) $4\frac{3}{4}$ " squares

Background Fabric (4) 4³/₄" squares

Steps:

I. Following the diagram, sew a nine patch block together using 1/4" seam allowances. Press well. The block should measure 131/4" square.



2. Cut the block in half vertically, and then again horizontally. This will create 4 units that are 65%" square.













- 3. Rotate the top right and bottom left so that the accent squares are on the corners.
- 4. Assemble a four patch with these units. The block should measure 123/4" square.


Libby will be in the Lobby at our next Guild meeting to receive any donations.

This month there are two tips!

- I. When buying a new cutting mat, make sure it is 36 " in length. This way you can easily cut one yard of fabric at a time.
- 2. Need an extra way to measure your fabric? Tape a fabric measuring tape securely to a kitchen counter for easy access in measuring widths of fabric.




