

September's Block is called the Duck Tracks Block.

There will be kits available at the meeting on September 2nd if you'd like to contribute to the charity quilt.



Any additional blocks made with your own fabric brought to the **NOVEMBER** meeting will be included in additional charity bee quilts. If you would like to make some blocks from your stash, use fall colors (browns, deep oranges, maroons, yellows, etc.)

Stitch these up and bring them to the **NOVEMBER** meeting on **Tuesday, November 4th**. Looking forward to seeing a beautiful assortment of your donated blocks!

September Block of the Month

What you'll need:

Fabric B

Background Fabric

(2) $3\frac{1}{2}$ "x6\frac{1}{2}" rectangles


(8) 3 1/2" squares

(2) 3 7/8" squares Fabric C

(2) 3 7/8" squares


Fabric A

(2) $3\frac{1}{2}$ "x6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles




Steps:


1. Use the Fabric A and B rectangles and use the stitch and flip technique to sew a $3\frac{1}{2}$ " background square to the corner - make sure to sew all four in the direction of the diagram.



2. Using the 2-at-a-time HST method, create (4) 3½" unfinished HSTs using the 3 7/8" squares of both the background fabric and Fabric C.



3. Make a 4 patch using one HST, one 3½" background square, and one of the stitch-and-flip rectangles. Repeat to make 2 four patches of each Fabric A and Fabric B.



4. Assemble the block as shown in the final block above, making sure to alternate Fabric A and B, and that all points are facing the right direction.

We have made a few changes on quilt entry. Please familiarize yourself with the new requirements:

- 1. Quilts entered in past TCQG shows, even if modified, will not be eligible for any of the judged categories but can be entered in the Display Only category.
- 2. The entry form will now require the Pattern Name and Pattern Designer's Name.
- 3. For quilts utilizing purchased software or templates there will be a space for the Quilting Design Name and Quilting Designer. It is optional this year but will be required in the future.

Glad to see so many members getting involved in making items for Boutique, donating items for Tin Can Raffle and Treasure Aisle, working on Schoolhouse, and Opportunity Quilt ticket sales, but we could use more of your talents to get ready for the show. Please consider volunteering by contacting one of the committee chairs or emailing the guild by visiting the website.

Lots of stray threads after each sewing session?

I got tired of having to pick up thread when I am cleaning up thread so I wrap clear packing tape around my wrist and just stick the thread on as I go.



This tip is from Deborah Durr:

I keep a small iron (on one of the wonderful Boutique TV Tray ironing stations) next to my machine. Unfortunately my memory isn't as good as I wish it was, and I frequently forget to turn off the iron when I leave the room. I read this tip on-line, and it has helped tremendously. Keep a Diaper Pin next to the iron and pin it to your top when you turn on the iron. Remove it when you turn the iron off. If you happen to spot it on your top later, immediately return to your studio and turn off that iron! [A clothes pin or something odd would also be a reminder.]




