

December Block of the Month

December's Block is this free pattern from Cuddle Cat Quiltworks of a Christmas Tree Block. Here's the free tutorial: https://cuddlecatquiltworks.com/blogs/tutorials/christmas-tree-quilt-block-12-finished



This is a pretty common block - there are tons of free tutorials you can find online for different sizes.

This is for a 12" finished block using scraps and she gives good graphics to see how the block comes together in this tutorial.

December Block of the Month

For Background Fabric

- 2 2 3/4" squares (for the flying geese unit at the top of the tree)
- 2 2 1/2" X 4 1/2" rectangles
- 2 2 I/2" X 3 I/2" rectangles
- 2 2 1/2" squares
- 2 2 1/2" X 1 1/2" rectangles
- 2 2 1/2" X 6" rectangles
- 8 2 1/2" squares (these will have diagonal lines drawn across them)

For Trees


- I 2 3/4" X 4 3/4" rectangle (for flying geese units)
- I -2 I/2" X 6 I/2" rectangle
- I -2 I/2" X 8 I/2" rectangle
- I -2 I/2" X I0 I/2" rectangle
- I -2 I/2" X I2 I/2" rectangle

For Tree Trunk

I - 2 I/2" X I I/2" rectangle

Steps:

- Make the flying geese unit with the smallest tree piece and two 2 3/4" background squares
- 2. Snowball the ends of the remaining tree strips with the 2 1/2" squares.
- 3. Make the base of the tree following the diagram.
- 4. Extend each snowballed strip with the correct size background piece following the diagram.
- 5. Assemble the block as shown above.

Bed Turning at the Quilt Show

We are bringing back the bed turning in 2026 as we celebrate 20 years of our guild. The bed turning will take place in the schoolhouse area during the quilt show.

A bed turning is a presentation where a variety of quilts are shown and discussed. We have done a different theme each time that the bed turning was held in the past.

2012 was vintage quilts
2014 was vintage baby quilts
2016 was 2 color quilts
2026 will be red, white and blue quilts

We will use two tables placed side by side to simulate a bed. The head end will be elevated for easier viewing by the audience. All of the quilts are stacked up and after each one is discussed, it is folded back, revealing the quilt underneath it. This is repeated until all quilts have been shown.

Guild members, if you have a red, white and blue quilt that you would like to have featured in the bed turning, please reach out to **Lisa Hart**. There will be a different form for the bed turning than the forms for entering a quilt into the show. This is a display only area, it is not for judged quilts. There are a limited number of spots available.



Three Tips for December

When identical quilt blocks are sewn together without sashing strips between them, a secondary pattern develops where the blocks meet. To easily preview this pattern with only one block assembled, lay the block facedown on a table. Fold the four corners into the center of the block. The small block formed where the corners match is the secondary pattern you'll see after the blocks are stitched together.



To save time and thread when making Half-Square Triangles, chain piece each square then - while stitched together - iron as a chain, then trim as a chain. After this final step, cut the pieces apart.

Quilt Rows

When a row of blocks is sewn, mark the top left corner with a pin or note to indicate it's the top left of row 1. Continue numbering additional rows this way so all stay in order.




