Block of the Month is changing in 2026!

What's the same? Each month I will send out a new block pattern in the newsletter. The kits will be available at the meetings each month. For the 3 months where we don't have meetings, I will bring kits for 2 different blocks to the following meeting.

What's different? This year, there will be a final mystery quilt top made of 12 - 12" blocks. If you'd like to make the quilt on your own, you can either make it scrappy and play as you get each month's pattern, or you can use the fabric requirements below to make a quilt out of yardage.

A	2/3 yard
B	1/3 yard
C	1/2 yard
D	1/4 yard
E	1/4 yard
Background	1 yard

January Block of the Month - Eccentric Star

Adapted from a Moda Blockheads block by Linzee Kull McCray

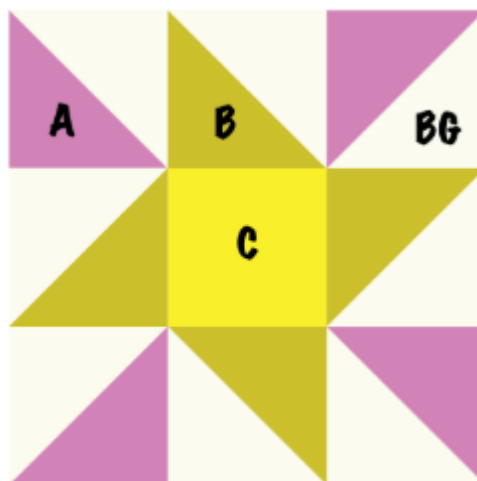
What you'll need:

Background Fabric (BG)
(4) 5" squares

Fabric A
(2) 5" squares

Fabric B
(2) 5" squares

Fabric C
(1) 4 1/2" square



This is perfect for charms or 5" square scraps. You can even use a couple favorite fat eighths for the colored fabrics!

Steps:

1. On the wrong side of each BG square, draw a line from one corner to the opposing corner.
2. Place BG squares right sides together with each of the A and B squares. Stitch a scant 1/4" seam on both sides of the drawn line.
3. Cut the square apart on the line to yield two HSTs, and press the seams to the darker triangles.
4. Trim HSTs to 4 1/2".
5. Stitch the units together following the diagram with fabric C square in the center of the 9-patch.



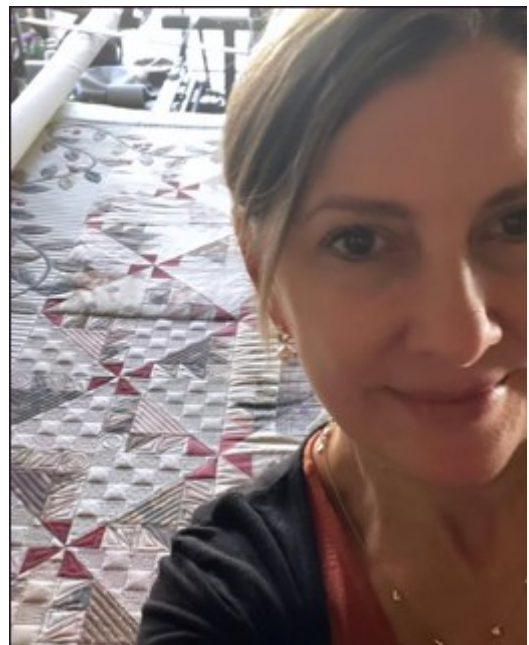

Celebration 20 Quilt Show Judges

SHAWN SICKLE, NACQJ Certified Judge

Quilting was something that Shawn Sickle admired from afar while she was busy raising a family and running a business. Her mother was an avid quilter, and they would regularly go to quilt shows over the years. Then in 2010, the opportunity came to make a quilt for her first granddaughter, and the rest is history, as they say.



That first quilt sparked an interest that has since blossomed into a passion. In 2018, she was introduced to longarm quilting which expanded her repertoire and catapulted the progression into quilt judging.

Since becoming a candidate of the National Association of Certified Quilt Judges (NACQJ), Shawn is actively judging and working in shows throughout the country. In 2023, she was a finalist in the Cherrywood Fabric Challenge and the Hoffman Fabric Challenge, as well as being juried into a Studio Art Quilt Associates (SAQA) show. Shawn is driven to pursue a judging certification through the NACQJ to share her passion for the craft as well as to empower and encourage fellow quilters.

Lois Kindley is an award-winning quilt artist and longarm professional with over 45 years of experience, having created hundreds of quilts and quilted more than 500 customer pieces nationwide. She is in the final stage of certification in the NACQJ's candidacy program, as she recognizes and values excellence in quilt show judging.

Bed Turning at the Quilt Show

We are bringing back the bed turning in 2026 as we celebrate 20 years of our guild. The bed turning will take place in the schoolhouse area during the quilt show.

A bed turning is a presentation where a variety of quilts are shown and discussed. We have done a different theme each time that the bed turning was held in the past.

2012 was vintage quilts

2014 was vintage baby quilts

2016 was 2 color quilts

2026 will be red, white and blue quilts

We will use two tables placed side by side to simulate a bed. The head end will be elevated for easier viewing by the audience. All of the quilts are stacked up and after each one is discussed, it is folded back, revealing the quilt underneath it. This is repeated until all quilts have been shown.

Guild members, if you have a red, white and blue quilt that you would like to have featured in the bed turning, please reach out to **Lisa Hart**. There will be a different form for the bed turning than the forms for entering a quilt into the show. This is a display only area, it is not for judged quilts. There are a limited number of spots available.

To easily aid in picking up pins, buy a magnetic wand from Amazon or a teacher supply store.



Seam guide - apply blue painters tape along any seam allowance to keep the fabric edge straight.
