





Story of a Scam:

Starts with "Your account access code on XXXX is: ##### as a text on your cell phone.

Implication: Someone is attempting to access your account on XXXX and this is the two factor (2F) check.

NOTE 1: You did not initiate this login, so someone is trying to break in to your account. 2F is working.

NOTE 2: Other devices known to XXXX may also get this same alert. 2F is working, but it's getting exciting.

IMPORTANT: No one has gotten access to your account at this point. 2F is working.

Your phone rings with an automated sounding call identifying themselves as support at XXXX telling you you'll be getting a follow call shortly.

Implication: These are the good guys looking out for you.

Warning Sign (WS): These are not the good guys. XXXX will NOT call you no matter what.

Precaution: Note the number, just for your records if you like.

Story of a Scam: Part 2

The real support ticket and the interaction (may have you reset your XXXX password) gives them credibility as they talk you through this process as though they do this every single day.

NOTE 1: All is still good, you've been working in the XXXX world and are still secure.

NOTE 2: All email and other confirmations are legitimately from XXXX.

Precaution: Your account has **NOT** been compromised. You're just resetting the account password.

THE GOTCHA:

Caller says you'll receive a text with a link to close your case. **THIS IS WHERE YOU'LL GET IN TROUBLE.**

NOTE 1: Don't accept a URL link from an unknown person. You really don't know this caller!

NOTE 2: The URL may be some slight variation on the official URL. Example: <https://appeal-XXXX.com>

NOTE 3: Most anyone can get or claim a close URL address. No sanity checks exist for these.

Precaution: Don't accept URLs from unknown sources. Don't even click out of curiosity.

Soon, a confirmation code request page will come to you. This is a spoof page. They retry your real XXXX account; you get a real confirmation code from XXXX and enter it into the spoof page. They receive the real confirmation code from the spoof page and enter it into the real XXXX confirmation page on their screen from their retry of your XXXX account. **ALL OF A SUDDEN, THEY ARE IN TO YOUR XXXX ACCOUNT AND YOU ARE IN TROUBLE WITH A CAPITAL T.**



February Block of the Month - Joyful Gathering

Adapted from a table runner pattern, originally by **Rebecca Lidstrom of Studio R Quilts**

What you'll need:


Background Fabric (BG)
(4) 2 1/2" squares

Fabric A
(2) 2 1/2" squares
(2) 6 1/2" x 2 1/2" rectangles
(2) 4 1/2" x 2 1/2" rectangles

Fabric B
(2) 4 1/2" squares

Fabric D
(2) 6 1/2" x 2 1/2" rectangles
(2) 4 1/2" x 2 1/2" rectangles

Fabric E
(2) 2 1/2" squares



Steps:

1. Create a four patch using (2) BG and (1) each of A and E 2 1/2" squares.



2. Stitch a 4 1/2" x 2 1/2" D rectangle to a four patch unit, making sure Fabrics A and D are touching.



3. On the long edge, stitch a 6 1/2" x 2 1/2" D rectangle to the unit, with Fabric A in the corner created by Fabric D.



4. Repeat steps 1 to 3 to create (2) identical units.

**Steps, continued:**

5. Stitch a B square to a $4 \frac{1}{2}'' \times 2 \frac{1}{2}''$ A rectangle.



6. On the long edge, stitch a $6 \frac{1}{2}'' \times 2 \frac{1}{2}''$ A rectangle to the unit.

7. Repeat steps 5 and 6 to create (2) identical units.

8. Assemble the block as a four patch, making sure to follow the diagram, with Fabric E in the outer corners.



Stitch up extra blocks with your stash to donate to the BOM scrappy top and bring them to the April meeting.

Celebration 20 Quilt Show Judges

JACKIE RUFFING, NACQJ Certified Judge

As a Certified Judge with NACQJ, Jackie has enjoyed sewing since she was very young, taking sewing classes with her mom while living in Japan. In 1972, she was introduced to quilts when her grandfather gave her a quilt that was pieced and quilted by her great grandmother. Once she saw the variety of fabrics framed with purple sashing, she was hooked.

Her desires to learn more led her to drafting patterns, hand quilting, to domestic machine quilting and then to her longarm machine. In 2001, she started her own quilting business and gradually through the years, found the joy in competition quilting with her own and her customers' quilts. She personally has won several awards for her quilts and quilting skills, including Best of Show, Exemplary Quilting Awards, along with her customers receiving local, regional, and national awards.

After 21 years, she put her business on hold to focus on the certification process as a certified judge with NACQJ. She has completed the program and has been designated as NACQJ Certified Judge. Before going through the certification process, Jackie would have said traditional quilts caught her heart. The certification process has broadened her appreciation for all genres and techniques. Today, Jackie finds inspiration in every corner of the quilting world. She hopes her comments, when judging, will reflect her desire to inspire and encourage quilt makers of all levels and to explore their creativity without any boundaries.





Celebration 20 Quilt Show Judges

STACY MILLER, Candidate NACQJ Judge

I live in Paris, Texas and have a BS in Nursing from UT in Arlington Texas and have worked as a RN for over 30 years. I am the mother of two children and the Mimi of two precious granddaughters.

The love of sewing came later in my life, but I vividly remember my mother sewing and watching her intently for hours, amazed of how the sewing machine, and she worked their magic! My sewing actually started on my mother's Kenmore sewing machine (at least 50 years old) when I took a break from my nursing career, and it hasn't slowed yet!!

I have been judging since 2019, local to regional venues ranging from 10 to 200+ quilts. I am a member of the American Quilters society. I am also active in my local quilt guild, Red River Valley Quilt Guild of Paris Texas where I am one of the co-founders of the Paris Quilt Show, which started in 2019. I am the Quilt intake coordinator, the display coordinator and the judging coordinator! I have given lectures to guilds about what the Judges are evaluating in a quilt. I have shown my quilts in several local and regional shows, where my first quilt (a caterpillar rag quilt) took Grand Champion and my embroidered Christmas tree skirt won a blue ribbon in the State Fair of Texas Arts and Crafts Show.

JUDGING PHILOSOPHY

Everyone's quilt has a special meaning to them. I strive to see their love for their quilt, by giving them encouraging words so that they will want to continue to sew with ways to increase the longevity of their design so that they can pass that quilt on to their friends and family for many generations to come. I use the principles of design, workmanship skills, complexity and difficulty of design for each piece with equal accountability for all.

Bed Turning at the Quilt Show

We are bringing back the bed turning in 2026 as we celebrate 20 years of our guild. The bed turning will take place in the schoolhouse area during the quilt show.

A bed turning is a presentation where a variety of quilts are shown and discussed. We have done a different theme each time that the bed turning was held in the past.

2012 was vintage quilts

2014 was vintage baby quilts

2016 was 2 color quilts

2026 will be red, white and blue quilts

We will use two tables placed side by side to simulate a bed. The head end will be elevated for easier viewing by the audience. All of the quilts are stacked up and after each one is discussed, it is folded back, revealing the quilt underneath it. This is repeated until all quilts have been shown.

Guild members, if you have a red, white and blue quilt that you would like to have featured in the bed turning, please reach out to **Lisa Hart**. There will be a different form for the bed turning than the forms for entering a quilt into the show. This is a display only area, it is not for judged quilts. There are a limited number of spots available.



Three Tips for February

Storing cut quilt pieces - Lay out a square of Press 'N Seal plastic wrap. Arrange cut pieces on it, labeled sized. Press another square plastic wrap piece on top and press to seal the pieces. Click the image to see the video —>

This may sound odd, but it works. Sometimes when working on a quilt top or pieces, you may accidentally stick a finger with a straight pin. You may get a couple of drops of blood on the fabric. Simply wet your finger with saliva and gently rub it on the blood spots. Keep repeating until the blood stain is gone. Someone gave me this tip and only a few days later I needed to do this. It works.

Tape a gift card or expired card to the faceplate of your machine, aligning the edge at 1/4 inch so you can guide your fabric seam to be 1/4 inch.


A Big Thank you from Charity Bee




